## **Maryland GA Highlights**

- HB 538/SB 651 Polystyrene Prohibition on Sale and Use
  - Would have made MD 1<sup>st</sup> state to ban polystyrene
  - Status: Unlikely to pass
- HB 766/SB 610 Forest Conservation Act
  - Amended version lessened original concern over "unfunded" burden on local governments and got MML/MACo support.
  - Status: In hearing.
- HB 400 *Mosquito Control Notification to Municipalities* 
  - Status: Passed in the House/Senate hearing 3/20

\_\_\_\_\_

- Bill that would raise standard tax deduction for
   State of MD, to counter increased tax burden from federal tax reform.
  - Status: Passed Senate; awaiting House.



## Virginia GA Highlights

- HB 1004—*Regulation of stormwater; airports* 
  - Concern: precedent setting stormwater fee exemption bill; didn't apply to this region's airports
  - Status: Didn't pass in House
- HB 801—Stormwater Regulation; no stricter than federal law
  - Concern: Limited SWCB from setting SW requirements stricter than federal law without Gen. Assembly approval.
  - Status: Didn't pass in the House
- HB 1150— Pavement sealants containing coal tar prohibited
  - Concern: Bill does not go far enough, per DOEE's findings.
  - Status: Didn't pass in the House



## Federal Legislation Pertaining to Water

#### Infrastructure funding proposal

- Proposal will generate \$1.5 trillion in new infrastructure investments, of which only \$200 billion will be from federal funding sources.
- The remaining \$1.3 billion will be funded from state, local and private sources.
- National water organizations (e.g., NACWA, WEF) are arguing for more federal dollars for water.

#### Water Resources Development Act (WRDA)

- Reauthorization every two years for U.S. Army Corps of Engineers projects.
- Has included water policy and infrastructure funding the last couple of reauthorizations—it's a door for water.
