Mr. Bradley will provide an overview of EPA guidance over time to address broader based planning and permitting options, focusing specifically on existing case studies across the country that have been working toward integrating programmatic requirements to achieve more effective/cost-effective/flexible options for meeting Clean Water Act requirements - under permit as well as enforcement scenarios.

# III. Chesapeake Bay Program Updates - Karl Berger & Tanya Spano (11:15 - 11:45 a.m.)

Mr. Berger and Ms. Spano will answer questions about several recent and upcoming Bay Program-related meetings and initiatives, and ask the members for input on several technical and policy issues that will be addressed (reference *Chesapeake Bay Program Developments* item) over the next few months.

IV. Water Resources Infrastructure: How to Frame the Issues - Tanya Spano & staff (11:45 a.m. - 12:15 p.m.)

Over the past few months there have been various COG-sponsored initiatives that have addressed water resource infrastructure issues, in addition to several ongoing local and national efforts. Infrastructure issues were discussed by a panel of experts (WSSC and DC Water's General Managers, & A. Rowley, Arlington County) at the November 16<sup>th</sup> CBPC meeting. The impacts of extreme events on water resource issues and infrastructure were also the focus of the Extreme Weather-Climate Events Workshop on December 17<sup>th</sup> (with presentations by NOAA, DC Water, WSSC, Fairfax County, WAD, as well as various local emergency management representatives). <u>http://www.mwcog.org/environment/water/water\_workshops.asp</u> In addition, COG's Climate, Energy, & Environment Policy Committee (CEEPC) is working to finalize goals and targets for its 2013-2016 work plan - some of which have water resource implications - and which the WRTC/CBPC were asked to comment on.

Ms. Spano and staff will highlight key regional infrastructure issues and common themes that have been identified in all of these venues; and outline work that is ongoing/planned to help the region better characterize the challenges and opportunities facing the region's water resource infrastructure (e.g., a COG Board/elected officials webinar).
