#### Review of Regional Household Travel Survey

- Collect empirical data on regional travel behavior from individual persons and households
- Primary source of observed data for model estimation, validation, and calibration (both for current trip-based model and future activity-based model)
- Data used for addressing regional growth and transportation planning issues
- Typically performed every ten years (last regional HTS 2007-2008, covered 11,000 households)
- Largest single discrete project (on cost basis) in UPWP
- 2017-2018 regional HTS will cover 15,000 households



# New Lead Survey Staff and Update on Survey Contractor

- New COG/TPB staff: Ken Joh, Ph.D., AICP, Senior Statistical Survey Analyst
- Survey contractor: Resource Systems Group, Inc. (RSG)
- RSG has used a web-based survey retrieval system and survey smartphone app for other recent HTS efforts
  - rSurvey: web-based retrieval system
  - rMove: survey smartphone app



## Testing rSurvey and rMove

- Two staff tried version of rSurvey most recently used for Connecticut Statewide Transportation Study
  - On-the-fly geocoding engine for trip ends / stops works well
  - Will require customization for our region (more transit operators, express lanes, etc.)
- Five staff tested rMove on iOS and Android
  - Some issues identified with transit trips, particularly mode of access and egress
  - GPS signal loss in buildings / Metrorail tunnels (anticipated, being addressed)
  - App constantly evolving
  - Will see latest version during survey pre-test



# **Updated Survey Schedule**

- Some items still subject to adjustment
- Kick-off: September 2016
- Survey pre-test: January 2017
  - Following election and major holidays
- Main survey: late Spring 2017
  - Following WMATA SafeTrack surges (Surges 12-15 revised schedule expected in December)
- Complete main survey: late Spring 2018
- All deliverables by end of 2018





## **Current Project Status**

- Kick-off meetings with RSG 9/16 (just RSG and data staff) and 9/22 (full consultant team with DTP Department Director and Travel Forecasting Program Director)
- Data development for sampling plan (ACS block group and other data sources, regional activity center boundaries)
- Identification of providers for address-based sample
- Outreach to State DOTs / WMATA for permission to use official logos on survey materials

- Continue sampling plan development
- Procurement of sample
