

Baltimore-Washington Parkway

- Established by Congress on August 3, 1950
- Opened in 1954 as a 29-mile scenic highway
 - One of multiple scenic entries into the nation's capital
 - A unique cultural landscape that blends architectural treatments with natural topography and scenic forests
- The NPS administers 18 miles of the 29-mile roadway
 - Maintenance efforts focus on safety, preservation of the aesthetic qualities and enhancing parkway character

 - Parkway Landscape
 - Architectural Treatments


Superintendent Vision & Priorities





Assessment of Conditions

- Federal Highway Administration and NPS Denver Service Center characterized roadway deterioration as;
 - Failed patches due to shoving, oxidation
 - Alligator cracking
 - High severity rutting
 - Delamination
 - Failed longitudinal joints
 - Surface beyond service life
 - Cracking along horizontal joints of cement base
