

# REPORT ON CRIME AND CRIME CONTROL

 METROPOLITAN WASHINGTON COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS

The most comprehensive crime statistics are reported by various agencies participating in the Police Chiefs Committee of the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (COG). The 2005 COG Report on Crime highlights the following serious or violent crime categories, known as Part I crimes: criminal homicide, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft.

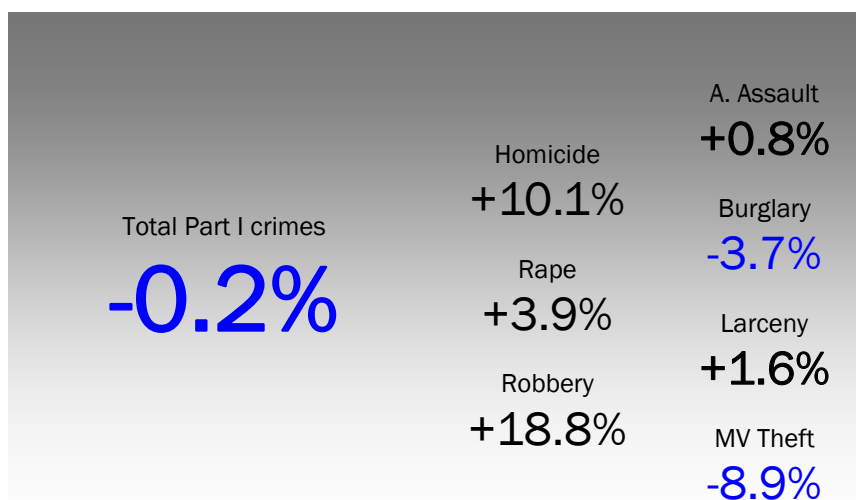
The crime data analyzed by COG shows an overall reduction in Part I crimes in 2005 compared to 2004. While stolen auto and burglary decreased from the previous year, the number of homicides, rapes, robberies, aggravated assaults and larceny crimes increased in 2005.

In 2005, there were 160,079 Part I crimes compared to 160,380 Part I crimes reported in 2004, a reduction of 0.2%. The overall regional Crime Index (crimes per thousand residents) was 34 for 2005 and 35 for 2004, a 3% reduction.

Police departments continue to implement new technology, information sharing, and public awareness outreach to control crime in the region. And with continued generous and positive political and public support, the COG region's membership moves forward with high expectations for future successful crime reduction results.

*The COG region continues to compare well with the national crime rate and surrounding states. However, the national crime figures are not published to date. The FBI estimates a 2% reduction of Part I crimes for the first six months of 2005 throughout the nation\*\*, while the COG region showed a 0.2% crime reduction for all of 2005.*

\*\* The FBI 2005 crime figures are published in October 2006 and currently provide only six months (January - June 2005) of estimated compared figures. A comparison with the annual COG report must be considered in context and should not be interpreted as conclusive.

*The data highlighted in this report is compiled annually by the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (COG) from data supplied by local police departments, sheriff's offices, and state and federal police services. The report informs government officials and the public on the nature of the crime problem in the COG region and provides law enforcement with criminal statistics for administrative and operational use.*

\* The data contained in this report is based on information that was provided to MWCOG by the individual jurisdictions.

- **It must be noted that reporting methods are not uniform throughout this report since some departments used the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) while others used the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS).** Recognizing the need for additional information about crime, the FBI launched NIBRS as an enhanced UCR Program . The FBI recognized that conversion to the new system would be gradual, so it is appropriate for agencies to still report under UCR. As a general rule, NIBRS crime rates tend to be higher than UCR rates, primarily because NIBRS statistically counts all separate violations within a single criminal event. UCR counts only the most serious crime. The average difference, however, is small.
- For some departments, only partial data or no data at all was collected. Where data is not shown, it was not provided. Data for Bowie, College Park, Gaithersburg, Rockville, and the U.S. Capitol Police was reported via another department. These numbers are reported with a dash.
- Crimes Per 1000 = Crimes per 1,000 residents.
