Landfill waste	77.09	37.80

DINING HALLS - KITCHENS

1. Students return trays to dish belt in dining halls

2. Compost Material is placed in the water trough and moves toward a Pulper and Hydro-extractor

3. End product is collected and aggregated on loading docks



SOIL AMENDMENT PROGRAM Somat's eCorrect System



- Rapidly dehydrates food waste along with compostable disposables
- Produces a humus-rich soil amendment without the use of enzymes, fresh water or venting
- Reduces the weight and volume of food waste and scraps by 80 to 90 percent and recycles those food wastes into a high-quality organic soil amendment in less than 24 hours
- Has an integrated revolutionary odor management system and high-efficiency heat recovery system, the eCorect can be fed any type of food waste and has zero landfill impact

SOIL AMENDMENT PROGRAM Somat's eCorect System

What They Learned:

- The eCorect is not large enough to handle all of our compost volume on campus
- Our post-consumer compost mix has too much "brown content" from non-food compost material
- The eCorect works well for Salad Room waste which is largely "green content"
- Soil Amendment from The South Campus Salad Room is being used for rooftop garden beds


