Purpose

- The purpose of the SLS is to build upon the region's ability to respond to and recover from, with limited resources, an incident of national significance through:
 - managing expectations of the general public;
 - maintaining critical infrastructure;
 - mitigating the magnitude of the economic impact and strengthening the interrelationships of public and private sector enterprise within the NCR.

Goals

- The SLS will be designed to build awareness of the unique challenges of a pandemic flu event in order for the participants to gain an understanding of the differences in managing a pandemic from other all-hazards emergencies and disasters.
- The SLS will provide an opportunity for NCR leaders to inform seminar participants on how their respective roles and responsibilities intersect in the context of a pandemic event that will have regional, national and global effects.

Objectives

Focus Area – Private Sector and Government Impact

- Develop an understanding of the interdependencies between private sector enterprise and the public sector during a pandemic, and their effects in the NCR.
- Examine how the impact a severe pandemic event on the workforce (private sector, government, and nonprofit) will affect business and government operations.
- Explore the economic impact a severe pandemic event will have upon businesses and commercial operations within the NCR over an extended period of time.

Objectives

Focus Area – Communication and Coordination

- Examine the decision-making authorities of various public safety and health officials for response to a pandemic, including the authority to declare a state of emergency and/or a public health emergency. Understand how decisions are communicated within the NCR.
- Gain an awareness of the decision-making process and the flow of information to the public during a pandemic event. Understand how emergency risk communication principles apply to an emerging or actual pandemic event.

Objectives

Focus Area – Communication and Coordination , Cont.

- Examine emergency risk communication methods for providing information to individuals in the NCR that better enable them make the best possible decisions about their well-being. Examine how risk communication messaging can be utilized to let the public understand that options for response may be severely limited depending upon the widespread impact of the pandemic.
- Develop an understanding of coordination and communication processes for local, state, federal, private and non-profit organizations and identify any gaps.

Method

The SLS will be a facilitated, scenario-based discussion focusing on high-level decisionmaking and policy development processes within a regional framework.
