Technical Assistance Program Overview

- TPB responds to requests for technical assistance from the state and local governments and transit operating agencies
- Not a federally-mandated MPO function Unique to TPB
- Tasks entail use of TPB-developed tools, techniques, data, and staff capabilities
- Supports DDOT, MDOT, VDOT, VDRPT, and Transit sub-area planning, travel monitoring, travel modeling, and data collection consistent with regional transportation planning priorities
- Funding is agreed-upon percentage of UPWP work program
- Technical Assistance support requests are developed through interagency collaboration and coordinated through the State Technical Working Group (STWG)



Overview: 3 General Project Categories

1. Assisting state and local agencies in pre-planning analyses

- Montgomery County, working with the Maryland State Highway Administration, requested support in analyzing feasibility of BRT
- Virginia Beltway travel time studies

2. Internal data gathering

- I-95/I-395 HOV counts
- Non-motorized counts in the District of Columbia

3. Studies that can help inform larger regional interests

- Commuter Bus Parking Study
- Regional Bus Service Provision Study

Potential Idea –TLC Program during the Spring 2020 Solicitation Funding for Transit Projects

- Short-term consultant assistance to local jurisdictions working on creative and sustainable plans and projects, which can include, among others:
- Corridor and transit station planning
- Bike/ped safety and access studies
- Transit-oriented development studies
- Design guidelines & roadway standards
- Streetscape improvement plans
- Safe Routes to School planning
- Trail planning and design
- Transit demand & feasibility analysis

• <u>Cost</u>: 1 to 3 projects with budgets varying form \$30 to 80 thousand



Potential Idea – Phase II Station Access Project

- TPB staff was directed to develop a limited list of high capacity transit station areas that will be regionally prioritized for pedestrian and bicycle projects.
- Status
 - Staff is completing technical analysis considers walksheds, potential demand (high employment/population density), and vulnerable populations
 - A project update will be shared with TPB in June and July. In fall, staff will begin seeking jurisdictional buy-in.
 - The list is anticipated to be complete by the end of the calendar year.
- Phase II...? Conduct a solicitation and fund projects for station areas on the prioritized list...?
- <u>Cost</u>: up to 3 projects with budgets varying from \$55-60 thousand?



Potential Idea – Transit Travel-Shed Analysis

- Research and acquire a tool for creating a regional place based transit travelsheds
- Develop transit travel sheds for each of the 141 Activity Centers.
- Tool will inform jurisdictions about transit accessibility of different Activity Centers
- Concept bubbled up from a TLC application
- <u>Cost</u>: To be determined
