
Home to one of the largest historic districts in Maryland




Walkable core, but most services are outside

Reduce greenhouse gas emissions and pollution 4







 - Complete on-street protected bike lanes on 7th Street, Baughmans Lane, and North Market Street
 - Create ongoing counts of bicycling in Frederick
- Building on Frederick's natural advantages
