# © CLRP APPROVAL OF LONG-RANGE PLAN SCHEDULED FOR JANUARY

The Transportation Planning Board (TPB) on January 16 is scheduled to approve a new long-range plan that includes a major new HOT lanes (high occupancy/toll lanes) project on 36 miles of I-395 in Northern Virginia.

The project will be the second HOT lanes facility approved for the region. In 2005, the TPB's long-range plan was amended to include HOT lanes on 15 miles of the Capital Beltway in Northern Virginia.

HOT lanes combine features of toll roads and carpool lanes. Carpoolers use the HOT lanes for free, while solo drivers pay tolls that automatically change according to varying congestion levels.

Four major new projects, including the HOT lanes facility, are scheduled to be included in the TPB's 2007 long-range plan—called the Constrained Long-Range Plan or CLRP—and the FY 2008-2013 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).


The HOT lanes project is not the only major Virginia project getting attention this year. The Virginia Department of Transportation is also proposing "spot improvements" on I-66 inside the Beltway, which has already generated lively discussion at previous TPB meetings.

The CLRP and TIP will be released for public comment at the TPB Citizens Advisory Committee on December 13. The TPB will be briefed on the draft documents at its meeting on December 19.

DECEMBER 2007

The TPB approves a new CLRP update and TIP every year. The CLRP includes all the major transportation projects that the region anticipates can be funded and built between now and 2030. The TIP is a sixyear, more detailed subset of the CLRP. All regionally significant projects must be included in the CLRP and TIP in order to receive federal funding.

In addition to being financially constrained, the CLRP and TIP must conform to air quality limits. TPB staff is currently analyzing the transportation networks in the draft CLRP and TIP to ensure they are in conformity with regional air quality

goals. As part of the final approval of the CLRP and TIP, the TPB must approve an air quality conformity determination showing that forecasted emissions will not exceed ceilings, called "mobile emissions budgets," established in the region's air quality improvement plan. On December 19 the TPB will receive a briefing on the draft air quality conformity determination.

The following new projects and studies are proposed for inclusion in this year's CLRP and TIP. They are represented on the map on page 3.

# **Projects Proposed for Construction**

**1.** US 340, Jefferson National Pike Interchange at Jefferson Technology Park, Frederick, MD

Construct a new, grade-separated interchange on US 340 to support existing and planned development. Funded by the developer.

Length: half-mile radius Cost: \$11 million Completion: 2009

# RELEASED FOR PUBLIC COMMENT ON DECEMBER 13

The 2007 Update to the Constrained Long-Range Transportation Plan (CLRP) and the FY 2008-2013 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) will be released for public comment at the December 13 Citizens Advisory Committee meeting. The Transportation Planning Board (TPB) is scheduled to vote in January on the updated CLRP and TIP. The public comment period ends January 12, 2008.

# 2. I-66 Spot Improvements

# Westbound, inside the Beltway

Reconstruct westbound I-66, extending and connecting a series of acceleration and deceleration lanes: spot 1 at Fairfax Drive to Sycamore Street; spot 2 at Washington Boulevard to the Dulles Airport Access Road; and spot 3 at Lee Highway/Spout Run to Glebe Road.

Length: 4 miles (total) Cost: \$75.6 million Completion: 2013 www.idea66.com

# 3. I-95/I-395 High Occupancy/Toll (HOT) Lanes Project

From Eads Street in Arlington to Garrisonville Road in Stafford County Reconfigure the existing High Occupancy

Vehicle (HOV) facility from 2 to 3 lanes. Convert the HOV facility to HOV/Bus/ HOT lanes. Transit Service Plans calls for major enhancements.

Length: 36 miles

Cost: \$882 million

**Cost breakdown:** \$492 million: Preliminary engineering, right-of-way acquisition and construction; \$390 million: Total Transit Service Plan operation and capital. **Completion:** 2010

# 4. Potomac Yard Transitway

Four Mile Run to Braddock Road Metro Station

Construct the Alexandria segment of a transitway from the Braddock Road Metro Station to the Potomac Yard Town Center and on to Four Mile Run that will ultimately run to the Pentagon.

Length: 2.5 miles

**Cost:** \$18.1 million **Completion:** 2011

## A. US 301 Waldorf Bypass


Washington Avenue/Turkey Hill Road to north of the MD 5 Interchange at T.B.

Study alternatives for upgrading and widening US 301 through Waldorf and/or constructing an access-controlled bypass

**Proposed Cost:** \$1.48 billion (Charles County/TPB Area); \$2.78 billion (total)

Proposed Completion: 2030

## **B.** Manassas National Battlefield Bypass

US 29 to planned Tri-County Parkway/Route 234

Close Routes 29 and 234 through the Manassas Battlefield Park to through traffic and construct a bypass north of the park.

Length: 8.9 miles

**Proposed Cost:** \$133 million **Proposed Completion:** 2020 www.battlefieldbypass.com

## **C. VRE Expansion**

City of Manassas to Gainesville and Haymarket

Preliminary engineering and environmental work to extend the VRA Commuter Rail Service from the City of Manassas to Gainesville and Haymarket.

Length: 11 miles

Proposed Cost: \$280 million

**Proposed Completion:** 2018
