Metro recently completed the first solar carport installation at one of four planned station installments. Atop the Anacostia parking garage, the solar canopy currently consists of 240 solar panels and is expected to have 3,000 solar panels that will generate electricity equivalent to the power used by 165 homes annually. When completed, the <u>projects</u> will be one of the largest community solar projects in the Mid-Atlantic Region.
