

# **Project Overview**

- Prepared for NCR jurisdictions and funded through Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI)
- Project coordinated with WV, PA, and DE per congressional mandate
- Database created for resources that include shelters, senior care facilities, hospitals, etc.
- Corrective Action Matrix created to identify items requiring follow-up action

#### Resource Guide

- Provides sheltering and evacuation resources to all jurisdictions
  - Is *not* a plan
  - Does not replace or supersede existing plans
  - Does not diminish the need for jurisdictions to plan and prepare for emergency response



#### Resource Guide Framework

Repository of information for emergency managers to aid in decision-making

Identifies necessary steps, considerations, and resources for hazard identification and response determination

Includes resource database for items such as shelters, senior care facilities, hospitals, etc. to support decision-making process

# Key Elements: Shelters

- Shelter Database: One of the Guide's most significant resources is a regional database of shelters. This database can provide instant information about shelters across the NCR, including:
  - Capacity
  - Locations
  - Staffing needs
  - Available resources:
    - Bedding
    - Food availability
    - Food preparation ability
  - Pet friendliness
  - Alternate pet shelter locations
  - Special needs resources
- Each of the NCR jurisdictions has been working closely with the American Red Cross to inventory large shelters (capacity >5,000). The database currently does not contain completed information for all jurisdictions.

# **Key Elements: Transport**

Transportation Inventory

The inventory catalogs the availability, type, and number of vehicles that could meet emergency requirements, including the vehicles, drivers, transfer/pickup points and standing agreements that could be activated.

## **Key Elements: Routes**

- Potential Evacuation Routes: The Guide contains a comprehensive, regional, unified profile of potential evacuation routes, including
  - Functional classification in the regional roadway system
  - Route length
  - Roadway dimensions and variability
  - Route capacity
  - Route constraints
  - Average weekday and peak period travel demand
  - Route signal control plans

### **Key Elements: Profiles**

- Information Resources: The Guide includes information profiles that include the location, constraints, average daily population, and special consideration for the following:
  - Healthcare facilities
  - Correctional facilities
  - Retirement care communities
- In addition, the team developed a community resources profile to identify resources required to support the evacuee population in a shelter during an emergency event (e.g., medicine, water, beds).

#### **Corrective Action Matrix**

- Includes recommended corrective actions and estimated timelines for remediation
- Identifies jurisdiction(s) affected by issue
- Prioritizes issues by impact on the NCR
- Identifies organizations with interests in resolving issue

#### **Resource Guide Benefits**

Established information resources to aid in rapid decision-making

 Has established working relationships that form the foundation of future regional planning
