Motor Vehicle Advocacy (from front):

favored by most members of our community. Unfortunately, we are still operating on an infrastructure spawned in in the 1950's-1960's. We need to remember the automobile's role in any future plans.

Pedestrian Advocacy:

For an automobile culture to thrive freely there needs to be organized protection for pedestrians. The public space is owned by a walker or biker just as much as it is owned my a motorist. Much improvement has been made in this field in the past 20 years. However, much work remains to be done.

Highway Safety:

While the United States might have some of the safest highways in the modern world, there are still examples of methods being used in other parts of the globe that might be applicable to the U.S. road network. There are three important pieces of the safety triangle: Driver alertness/education, automobile design and maintenance, and highway safety.

Suburban Issues:

Having been born and raised in the Prince George's County suburbs I spent the first 20 years of my life in the Washington suburbs. I regularly travel throughout Montgomery and Arlington Counties, this has (like the downtown experience) made me realize the difference between something that works and something that can be improved (regarding traffic situations).

Road/Bridges Advocacy:

I think after the bridge collapse in Minnesota everybody would put label themselves as an advocate for Roads/Bridges. These are some of the most important parts of our infrastructure, it's time that they received a bit of the maintenance and rehabilitation that they deserve.

Student Issues:

I am currently a teacher at a middle school in Arlington County. I am aware of numerous transit/road-student issues. Examples of this include training, accessibility and pedestrian training.

Transportation Funding:

I believe most citizens would be willing to pay for road improvements if they could be guaranteed that they would see some results of their spent dollars. Transportation funding is the elephant that nobody wants to admit is in the room.

Highway Commuter:

Some of the quietest transportation experts in our region are those who spend hours a day having to plow through our crowded arteries because of unbuilt roads and unkept promises. The highway commuter deserves a level of service from their government that they might not be receiving at the present.

1. Why are you interested in serving on the TPB's Citizen Advisory Committee? I am interested in serving on the COG Transportation Planning Board's Citizen Advisory Committee because I can make a contribution from a citizen's perspective regarding issues that require "forward thinking and planning" focusing on resolving present and future regional transportation issues affecting the Metropolitan Washington area. For example, for the past several years, I have attended and participated at COG's transportation-related meetings and I presently represent my office located within within the Response Operations Division at FEMA. This representation has included observations from a Federal perspective—although COG represents State and local governments within the region. Seldom have I observed input/s provided to the Board from a citizen's perspective. Citizen dialogue could prove to be invaluable in the search for viable answers to questions such as those that follow: 1. Are major, public transportation systems adequate or customer friendly? 2. Are transportation routes accessible to the disabled/disenfranchised-who must travel without the assistance of pre-designated guardians? 3, Do existing transportation modalities promote pedestrian safety? Is public information provided-on an on-going basis-- that [a] solicits comment, participation at hearings, or [b] is public awareness information disseminated at news stands, kiosks, the news media and/or through community meetings such as civic association meetings, ward meetings, council meetings, schools, inter-jurisdictional meetings, etc.?

A major misnomer and/or perception is that "all residents" own or have access to a computer or are computer literate. Yet, it is not unusual—in fact, it is mostly the norm---to refer residents, visitors, children, etc. to web pages for information regarding changes in public transportation schedules both within and outside of the Metropolitan Washington area. The absence of this information is one factor affecting public safety—particularly during unfavorable weather conditions [or] after hours in high-crime locations or residential areas. Quite often, the local media or concerned officials make needed public service announcements "after the fact."

Another major concern is the need for more aggressive public information in schools and other public forums that address the newly emergent transportation-related public and

pedestrian health and safety threats to metropolitan Washington area citizens that involve-in toto or in part--, trains, taxicabs, buses, delivery trucks, motor cycles, mopeds, skates---- and pedestrian inattentiveness and disregard for pedestrian damaged walkways and traffic lights or the dangers of walking or running during unsafe road conditions. These measures are greatly needed; however, with the influx of non-English speaking residents in the region, it is questionable whether public health and safety and transportation-related conditions are understood. COG TPB sponsorship of public information and public safety forums could be beneficial particularly in the area of transportation-information sharing. A mascot could even be adopted to call attention to some of the issues and safety concerns to both children and adults.

IN SUMMARY, I am interested in serving on the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board's Citizens Advisory Committee because I believe that I could share information and views from both a Federal, COG, District of Columbia perspective. Having served in the Federal government [FEMA] since its creation in 1979; participated as a committee member/participant on several COG committees--[including but not limited to--the Health Committee, Transportation Planning Committee, Exercise Training Committee, etc.]; and, served on the District of Columbia's Local Emergency Planning Committee and other committees throughout the region that are too numerous to mention in this application for your consideration.

In conclusion, I am interested in serving because I believe that I, along with other committee members, can contribute to the achievement of strategic goals of COG as those goals relate to COG's Strategic Plan focusing on greater public participation and inputs re: critical transportation decisions.. I am an experienced academician and have taught courses at the University of Maryland, Marjorie Webster College, Hood College, the University of the District of Columbia, and Michigan State University. Areas of expertise at the University-College-levels have focused primarily in Business and Public Administration. Also, I am an experienced technical writer and have over 28-+ years in emergency management and response at the Federal, State, and local levels.

**Presently**, I am employed at the Federal Emergency Management Agency, Department of Homeland Security, Response Operations Directorate, as an Emergency Management Planning Officer.

I am a resident of WARD-4 in the District of Columbia and request that my application be considered, not as a Federal employee, but as a District of Columbia resident.

3. Please briefly describe your experience related to the interest areas you checked in question 2 that you feel may contribute to your effectiveness on the Citizens Advisory Committee. As a DC resident for over 40 years and a Federal employee for over 28 years serving in the Metropolitan Washington area, I have witnessed many changes in transportation, land use, displacement of entire communities to make room for new modes of transportation, changes in transportation routes that created in part the loss of sidewalks, trees, and a sense of community.

One need only look at the exodus of newly emerging communities borne of high rises that continue to house transient Federal, State and local workers—leaving once closely knit communities fragmented. Trends such as these have created inner city highways between 7:30am and 5-6:30pm in the metropolitan Washington area—all in the name of progress. Yet, after 7:30pm, the metropolitan Washington area resembles a ghost town. Except for taxicabs and Metro buses—whose schedules are often determined by weather conditions—no other alternative "after-hours" form of transportation exists—except METRO/METRO-RAIL/AMTRAK trains where patrons are reluctant to risk rider ship due to escalating crime.

As an emergency management planning officer, and a DC resident, I am concerned about disaster preparedness and response/recovery issues that in my opinion are functionally and integrally related to the transportation network, traffic density, and the lack of clear public service messages and "hands-on" "show and tell" kinds of demonstrations that should be taking place throughout

the area to educate and inform residents of 1. Evacuation routes; 2. In-place Sheltering Strategies and protective measures; 3. The development of "Family Emergency plans and procedures" when either impacted by a natural disaster while traveling by car or some other mode of transportation [or] while in the home when residents are required to shelter-in-place or risk the perils of traveling by car or on foot during mass evacuations.

Land-use, affordable housing, telework, transportation funding, etc., are all functionally and integrally related to transportation issues that need to be addressed and resolved in the region. Environmental concerns and environmental justice are mutually intertwined.

### 1. Why are you interested in serving on the TPB's Citizen Advisory Committee?

I've developed a great interest in transportation and safety issues over the past five years. As a teacher in Langley Park, Prince George's County, Maryland, a majority low-come, Hispanic community, I couldn't help but notice the great numbers of people running across six lanes of traffic to go to or from on-street Metro bus stops without regard to crosswalks placement. At University Avenue and New Hampshire Blvd, we had the most dangerous intersection for pedestrians in the state of Maryland.

This language minority population depends heavily on mass transit to get to work. They need safer roads to cross, drivers who don't speed through this urban area, and access to information on routes and schedules. The Latinos in Langley Park, like residents of many cultures all over the Washington Metropolitan area, deserve to live and work in a clean, attractive environment. They should be able to walk or cycle to points where they can join other commuters using a combination of buses, light rail and walking paths to get to where they need to go to sustain their families.

Additionally, I'm concerned about pollution in the region. Private autos contribute to poor air quality, and runoff from roads, parking lots, and the rest of the concrete jungle impacts water pollution of our rivers and the Chesapeake Bay.

Five years ago, I decided that the local low-income, majority Hispanic residents needed pedestrian education. One way to reach them through the language barrier was to teach the children concepts offered by programs such as Street Smart, Safe Routes to School's Walk and Bike to School Day, and the Washington Area Bicycle Association's program so that the children could in turn teach their parents. "Just say no" to crossing six-lane roadways between crosswalks, I told my students. I coordinated Walk Your Child to School Days at Langley Park-McCormick Elementary School in Prince George's County, Maryland, for the past four years, even after transferring to a nearby school in Takoma Park. This required working with the County Highway Safety Office, County Police and local leaders.

Along with the local business association, I helped to form the Takoma-Langley Multi-jurisdictional Pedestrian Safety Committee, focusing on the 3 E's solutions: Education, Enforcement and Engineering. The state of Maryland has since funded a transit center to get pedestrian bus transit riders away from the bus stops and onto a central location. I chaired the City of Takoma Park's Safe Roadways Committee for two years, tasked with working with City planners on projects and programs that would improve pedestrian and bicycle safety. I've volunteered with the Takoma Park Police in crosswalk education and enforcement activities, informing walkers in Spanish of reasons for using the crosswalk. I also worked with local parents and schools on a committee to start a Safe Routes to School program in Takoma Park.

Now, I'm working for several months with the newly-formed Purple Line Master Plan Advisory Group in Montgomery County. My interest is in moving forward with the east-west rapid transit (probably light rail) line which will stop at the Takoma-Langley Crossroads, where a Sector Plan has established that a transit center will be built. The Purple Line stop will provide a great linkage with Metrobuses, pedestrians, cyclists and even drivers.

Last week, I was honored along with Takoma Park Mayor Kathy Porter at the Takoma-Langley Crossroads Development Authority's 20th anniversary dinner for contributions to the area as a pedestrian safety and transportation projects advocate.

### 4. Is there any other information related to your serving as a member of the TPB Citizens Advisory Committee that you'd like to tell us about?

Former Maryland Governor Parris Glendening spoke at the recent Takoma-Langley CDA's anniversary dinner last week about Smart Growth. I'd read about it and agreed that we need to focus on development in existing urban areas instead of building more in the suburban and ex-burban areas from which workers commute by car since this necessitates the building and maintenance of more and more roads and adds to air pollution. I followed up in my speech, asking that Former Gov. Glendening retain some of the urban green spaces in the interest of attractiveness for city dwellers.

Many years ago, I developed an interest in regional growth and economic development. I keep up on local issues in several newspapers as well as on the local radio and TV news. I consider myself well-informed, and I in turn communicate with local committees. This interest could have its roots in all of the economics courses I took at the University of Maryland for my undergraduate business degree.

I speak, read and write Spanish with moderate ability.

Affordable Housing: I had an accessory apartment in MD, actually providing a low cost unit in a high cost area. As a public employee (enlisted military) with a large family, I needed low cost housing. Now, much better off, I remain very interested in the issue.

Bicycle Advocacy: I have always been an avid biker. I appreciate the wonderful recreational biking opportunities of the area, but have found biking in the area not to be a useful transportation alternative. Improvements (much needed) in the public transportation system should, in my opinion, include the requirements of bicycle users.

Business/Chamber: My family experience includes small business, private corporation and finance. I am a program manager of an 800 person non-profit corporation, so I'm knowledgeable and interested in business success.

Freight/Rail/Trucking: My military experience included operational and contingency planning, both at the national (Pentagon) and operational (moving medical forces in and out of Bosnia) levels. I assisted in the development of contingency plans to respond to major disasters. (I served as the Army's Office of the Surgeon General as the Medical Nuclear, Biological and Chemical Defense Officer.)

Telework: My current employer has a telework program and I have direct reports who telework.

Smart Growth: I live in Bethesda, a great place to live because of the vision and foresight of leader: who believed in smart growth.

Environmental Concerns: I served as a preventive medicine (health physics) officer, protecting health and the environment, for over 20 years. I supported a balanced program of meeting the mission and protecting the people and environment.

Pedestrian Advocacy: I am aware that traffic calming and traffic enforcement are essential for pedestrians and bikes to be able to effectively share the road. Strict enforcement of speed (cameras) and laws that restrict cell phone use while driving need to be viewed by the community as reasonable and not a game (a need for a public safety campaign tied to a program that raises speed limits to match the reality of effectively moving traffic?)

Highway Safety: I'm a strong proponent of increasing safety, but recognize that a systems of systems approach is required for it to be really improved (that is, there is a need to look at second and third order effects). I believe in Washington, that safety would be increased if we could improve signage (reduce the number of cars taking risks to correct for mistakes), increase public transport usage (get cars off the road), increase teleworking (again, get the cars off the road), and similar win-win changes. I believe too many people (and many experts) define highway safety too narrowly. Given my background in preventive medicine, I've always been interested in and advancing safety and very aware of how difficult it is to perform risk assessments, making effective risk based decisions, and gaining consensus to implement those decisions.

Transit-Oriented Development: One need only visit New York to see the value and effectiveness of transit-oriented development. If the current greater Washington area population growth (upward) and transportation growth (static) patterns continue, smart alternatives (such as smart-growth transit-oriented-

development) must be put into place now.

**Transportation Funding:** I'm a successful program manager with experience is raising and managing funds. I've no direct experience in transportation funding.

Road/Bridges Advocacy: I live in MD and work in DC and VA. Need I say more?

Transit Rider/Transit Advocacy: For 5 years (1990-1996), I bussed, car pooled or 'slugged' from Woodbridge, VA to the Pentagon. I actively (and unsuccessfully) seek a reasonable public transit solution for my current needs. I am an advocate of high quality, distributed, and timely transit.

Senior Citizen Issues: We all have (or wish we still had) parents. And soon, the baby boomers will be the senior citizens and the transportation system will be changed to meet their needs and demands.

Highway Commuting: I've already described my broad communing history and needs. I hope that I am part of the advisory committee to advocate for action and solutions.

Bicycle Advocacy / Parks and Trails: I have been a dedicated runner and bicyclist for over 30 years. I use the northern Virginia bicycle trails at least weekly thru most of the year (C&O Canal; W&OD Trail; Fairfax Cross County Connector Trail, etc). I use the Fairfax County Park Authority facilities.

Environmental Concerns / Environmental Justice: I am active in my church's Stewardship of Creation ministry and thru that activity have learned more about and become more involved with local organizations involved in preserving the environment. I am very concerned that a balance be maintained between the needs to support new residents (and the resulting development required) and the need to maintain clean air, streams and green spaces. I believe there is a continual tension between developers (including those who support building more and wider roads as a solution to all growth challenges) and those dedicated to protecting our natural resources. I am for protecting our natural resources.
