School meals are a critical source of nutrition for many of our region's children. During COVID-19 they have been available to all youth under 18 years old, irrespective of income and enrollment status. Despite broad availability of meals, participation rates remain low regionally and nationally.

Speakers will share federal and state updates and priorities for school meals and summer meals for the remainder of the federal fiscal year, offering recommendations on local and regional action to increase participation. Speakers may also address other programs like WIC and the Pandemic-EBT program.
