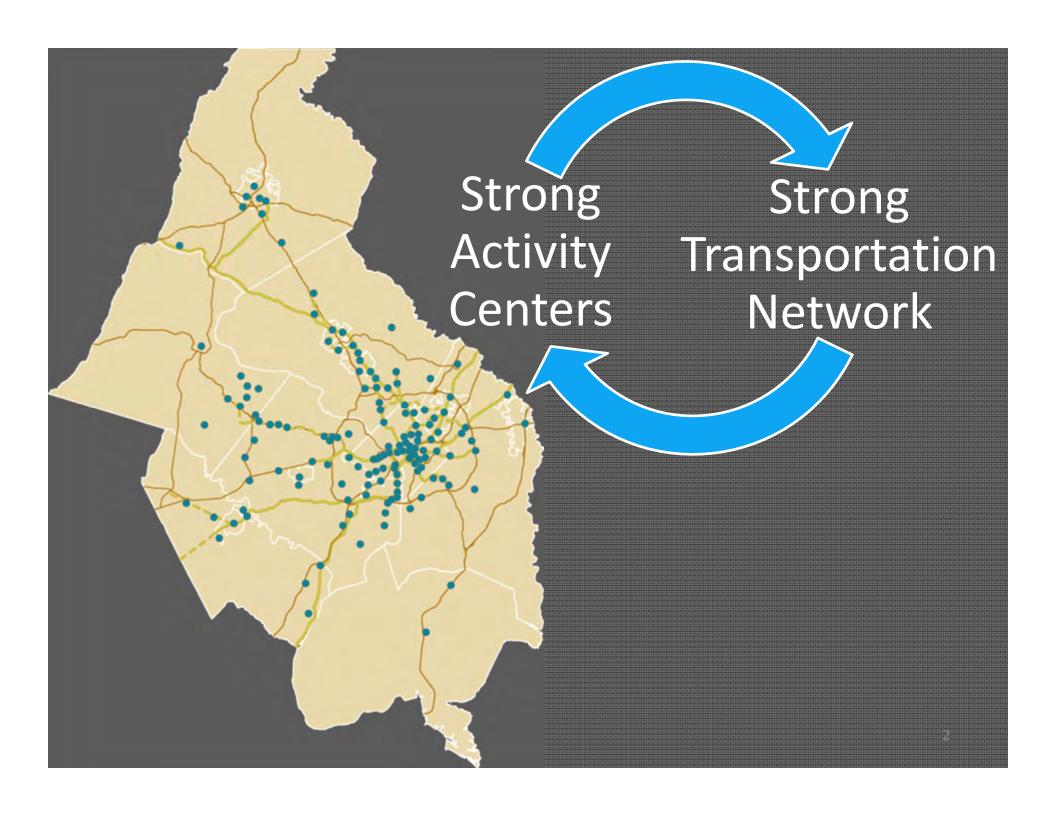












Progression of Activity Centers

- 1998 TPB Vision
 - Called for designation of Activity Centers for better coordination of land use and transportation planning
- 2002 Activity Center Map
- 2007 Activity Center Update
- 2013 New Activity Center Map
 - Major update to better align local and regional planning

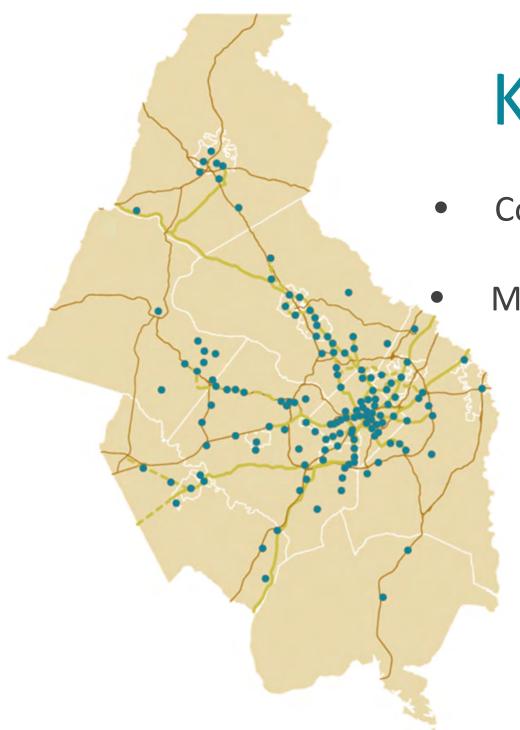
Activity Center Selection

Required Attributes

- Designation as priority growth area in locally-adopted land use plan
- By 2040, persons/acre density in top half of densities for that jurisdiction

Additional Attributes (2 of 4 required)

- High intersection density
- High-capacity transit (existing or planned)
- Mix of land uses (office, retail, residential, etc.)
- Housing & transportation costs not exceeding 45% of regional median income



Key Outcomes

Consistent with local planning

More, smaller Activity Centers

More mixed-use

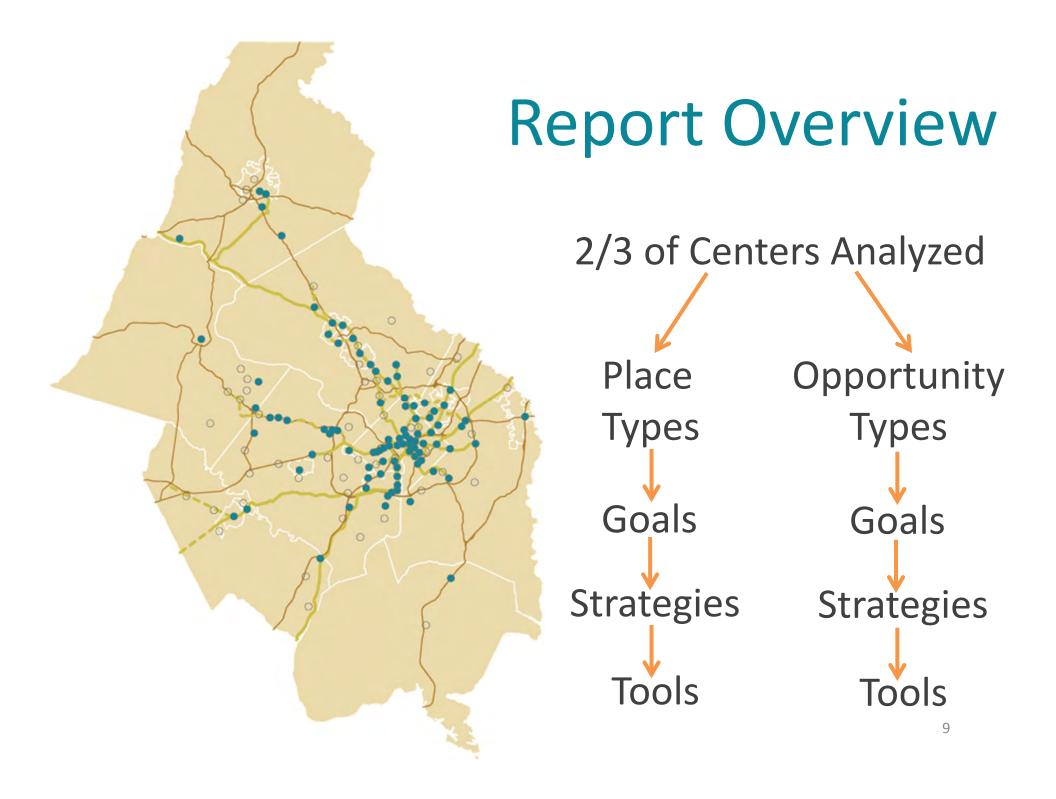
Aligned with existing & planned transportation network

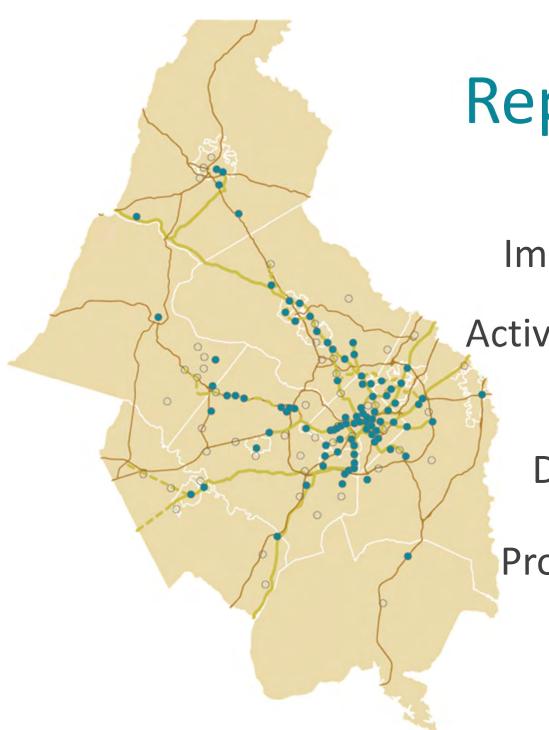
Place + Opportunity

- Approved by COG Board in January 2014
- Resource to support local government investment in Activity Centers
- Identifies similar challenges & needs among Centers, & provides goals, tools, & strategies to help communities meet their aspirations

Finding (& Sharing) What Works

- Regional perspective: Activity Centers with common characteristics can benefit from similar strategies
- Creates "common playbook"
- Facilitates regional knowledge-sharing—local governments can learn from each other

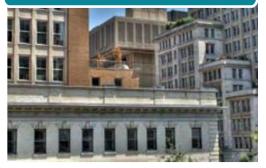

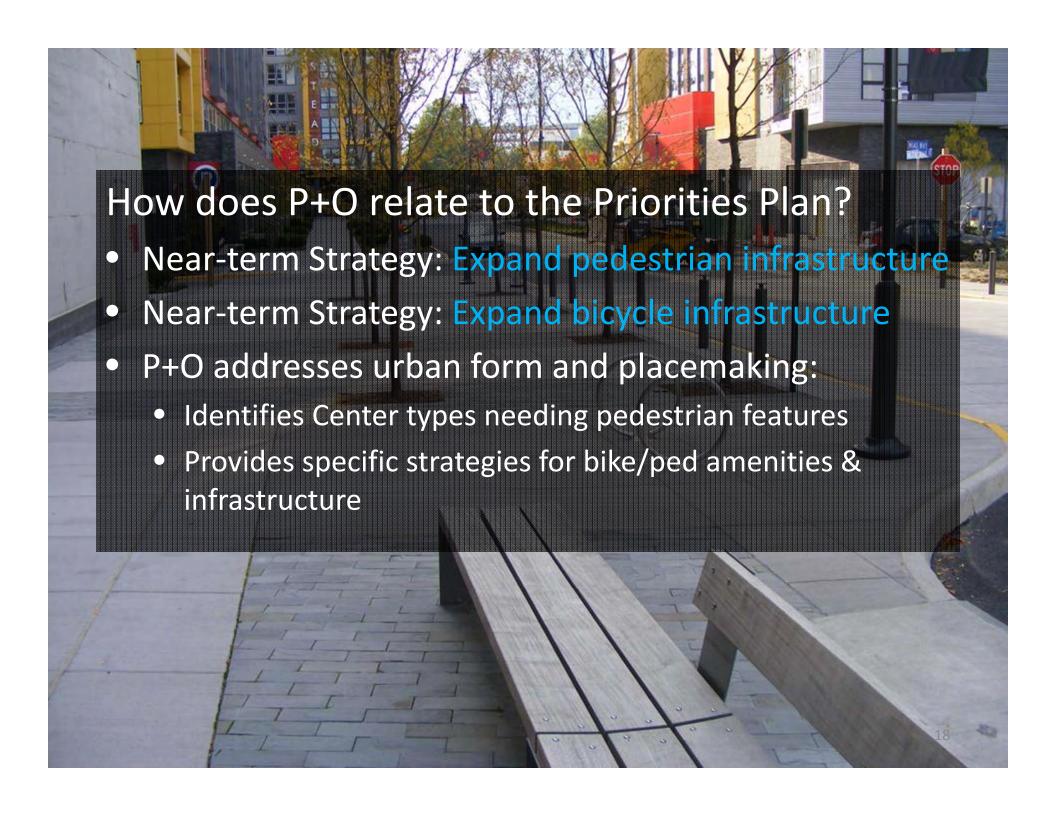

How does P+O relate to the Priorities Plan?

- Long-term Strategy: Concentrated growth in Activity
 Centers
 - Jobs/housing balance in each Activity Center
 - Range of attractive, affordable housing choices
 - Support for Centers on eastern side of region
 - Tailored density & design, not one-size-fits-all
- P+O identifies distinct Center types, development needs & strategies for each type
 - Strategies/tools for affordable housing, job access, transit access to increase "opportunity"
