Mr. Lovass will provide an update on the status of federal air, climate, and energy regulations with an emphasis on U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) proposed Safer Affordable Fuel-Efficient (SAFE) Rule and the Affordable Clean Energy (ACE) Rule. State agencies will be asked to discuss if/how the shifts in federal policy are influencing state initiatives and responses.
