GSA LOCATION POLICY AND COG REGIONAL ACTIVITY CENTERS WORK SESSION OBJECTIVES

Objectives:

- Affirm intention to submit GSA "Central Business Areas" and to use Activity Centers as the beginning point.
- Crosswalk GSA Location Policy objectives w/ACs (technical brainstorm)
 - o What works; Identify gaps of data; determine how to fill
 - What needs to be left for individual discussions (what won't work...)
- Construct a process for the test and for jurisdictions to work w/GSA NCR to est. CBAs
- Consensus with remaining jurisdictions on the approach

Outcomes:

- Common understanding among GSA, COG, and jurisdictional representatives on an approach
- Agreed upon plan for technical aspects of what's being measured
 - o Consensus on what is usable and what else is needed moving forward
- Develop a process and schedule for GSA to use ACs as part of location decisions, and
- Establish buy-in across region jurisdictions
