In July MWAQC voted to develop a SIP for the Annual PM2.5 National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS). EPA's deadline for the Annual PM2.5 SIP is April 5, 2008. Staff is preparing to present a draft SIP to the Technical Advisory Committee by its November 13, 2007, meeting. Staff will discuss the SIP schedule.
