The Technical Committee met on April 6 at COG. Five items were reviewed for inclusion on the TPB agenda on April 18.

TPB agenda Item 7

The Committee was briefed on the growth over the years in the participation in the regional Bike to Work Day, and on promotion activities for the events being organized at fifty-eight locations in the region for Friday May 18.

TPB agenda Item 8

At the March 21 meeting, TPB members provided comments on a draft Regional Complete Streets Guidance and Policy Template after receiving comments from the Citizens Advisory Committee. The Committee was briefed on comments received and proposed responses for revising the Guidance and Policy Template, and on the schedule for approving a revised document

TPB agenda Item 9

In Spring 2011, 2,400 households in six focused geographic subareas of the region were surveyed to obtain demographic information and travel data for more intensive analysis of specific growth and transportation issues. The Committee was briefed on comparisons of the household travel characteristics and behavior identified in different subareas of the region, and on the schedule for surveying additional subareas.

TPB agenda Item 10

The Committee was briefed on the results of recently completed projects under the Continuous Airport Systems Planning (CASP) Program, including trends and forecasts for air passenger originations and air cargo, and ground access travel times to the region's three airports.

TPB agenda Item 11

The Committee was updated on the ninth extension of SAFETEA-LU through June 30, 2012, and the likely schedule for further Congressional action on the reauthorization of Federal surface transportation legislation.

Two items were presented for information and discussion:

 The Committee was briefed on the new geographic areas and populations of the urbanized areas in and near the Washington region based upon recently released 2010 Census data. The Committee was briefed on activities to date on the development of The TPB Regional Transportation Priorities Plan (RTPP) which will use performance measures to identify regional challenges and potential near and long term strategies to address them.
