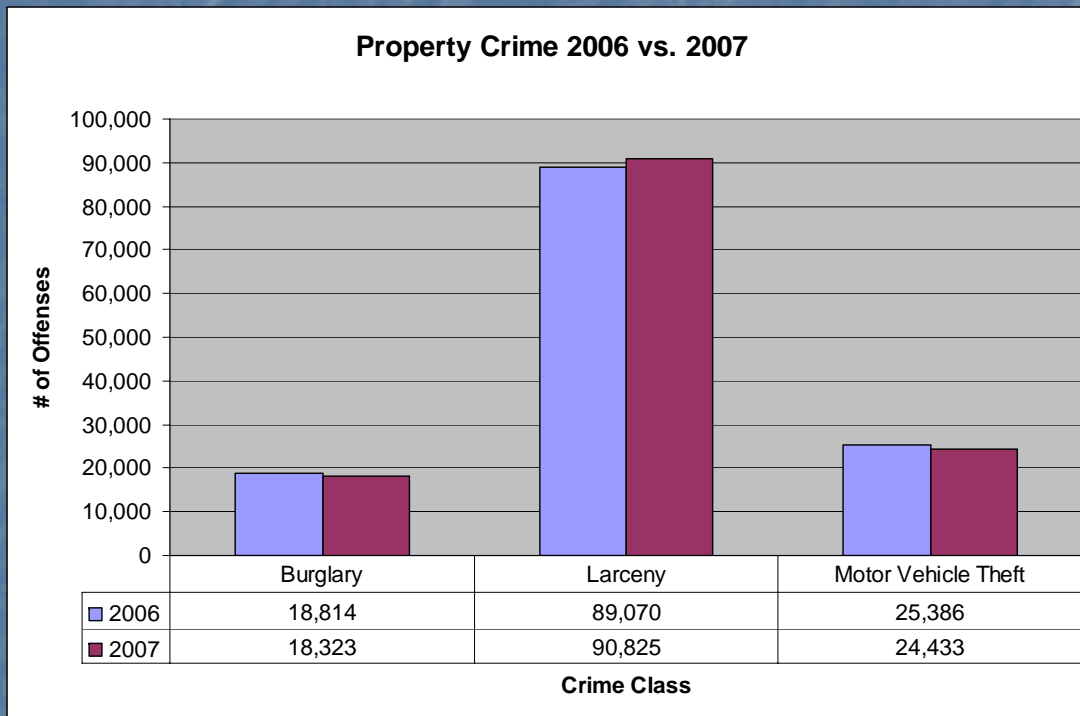

Summary

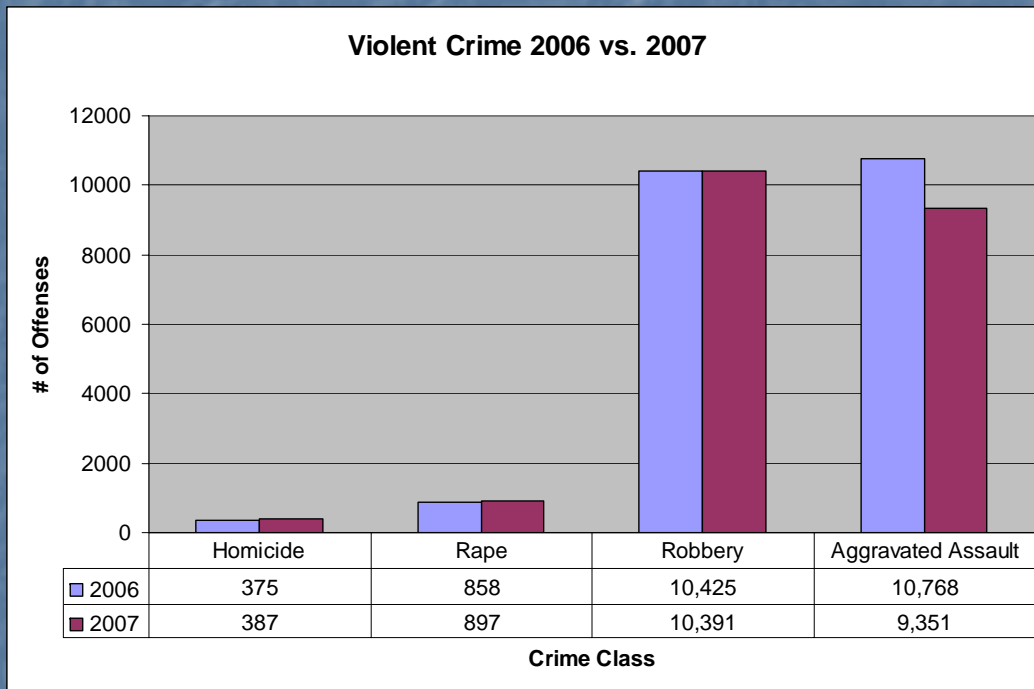
- Overall, Part 1 crime decreased in region.
- Although homicides increased, violent crime decreased overall.
- Reported property crime increased slightly.
- Multi-year crime trends are generally down, except for larceny.

Property Crimes 2006 vs. 2007



- Burglary -2.61%
- Larceny + 1.97%
- Motor Vehicle Theft - 3.75%

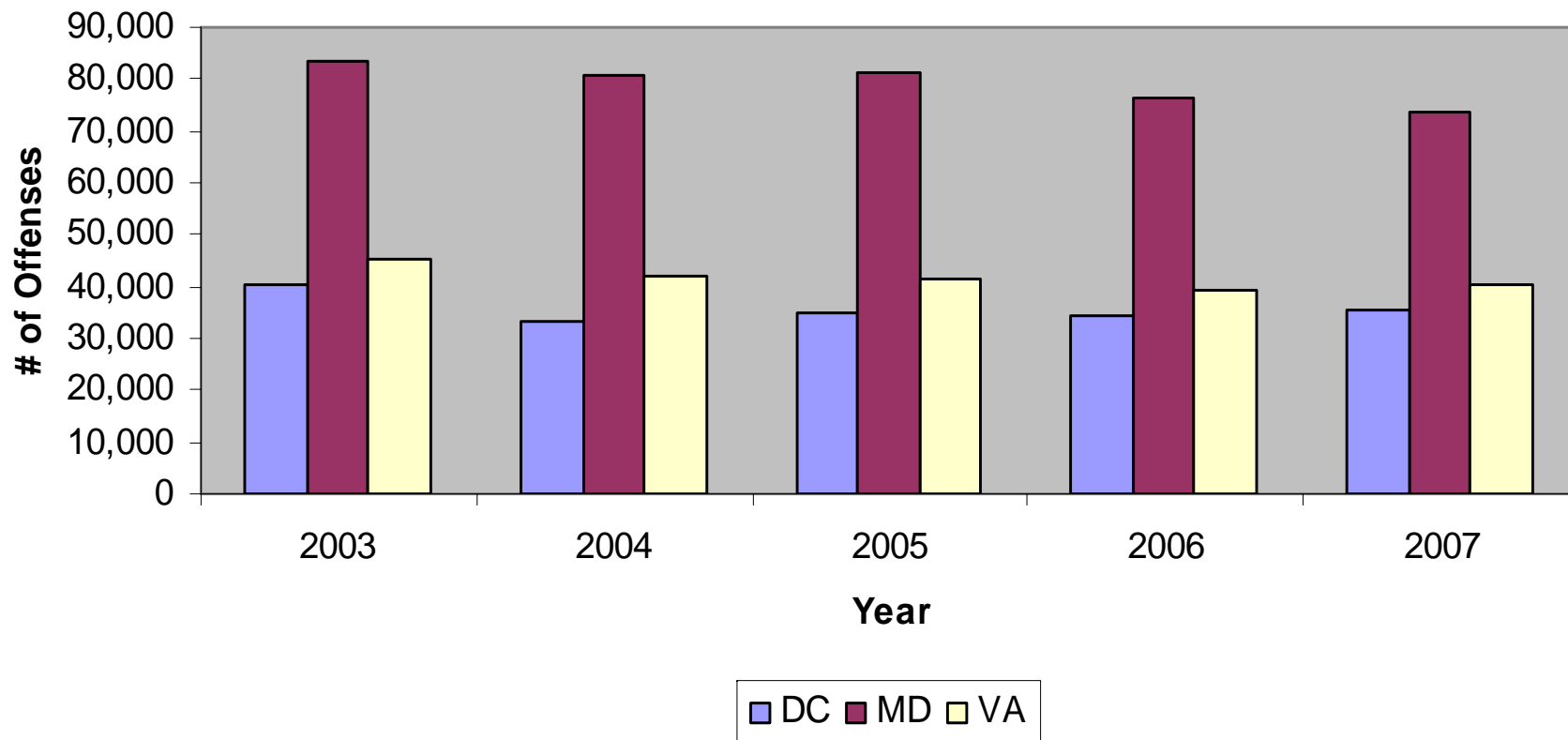
Violent Crimes 2006 vs. 2007



- Homicides + 3.20 %
- Rapes + 4.55%
- Robbery - 0.33 %
- Aggravated Assault - 13.16 %

Crime Trends by Region 2003-2007

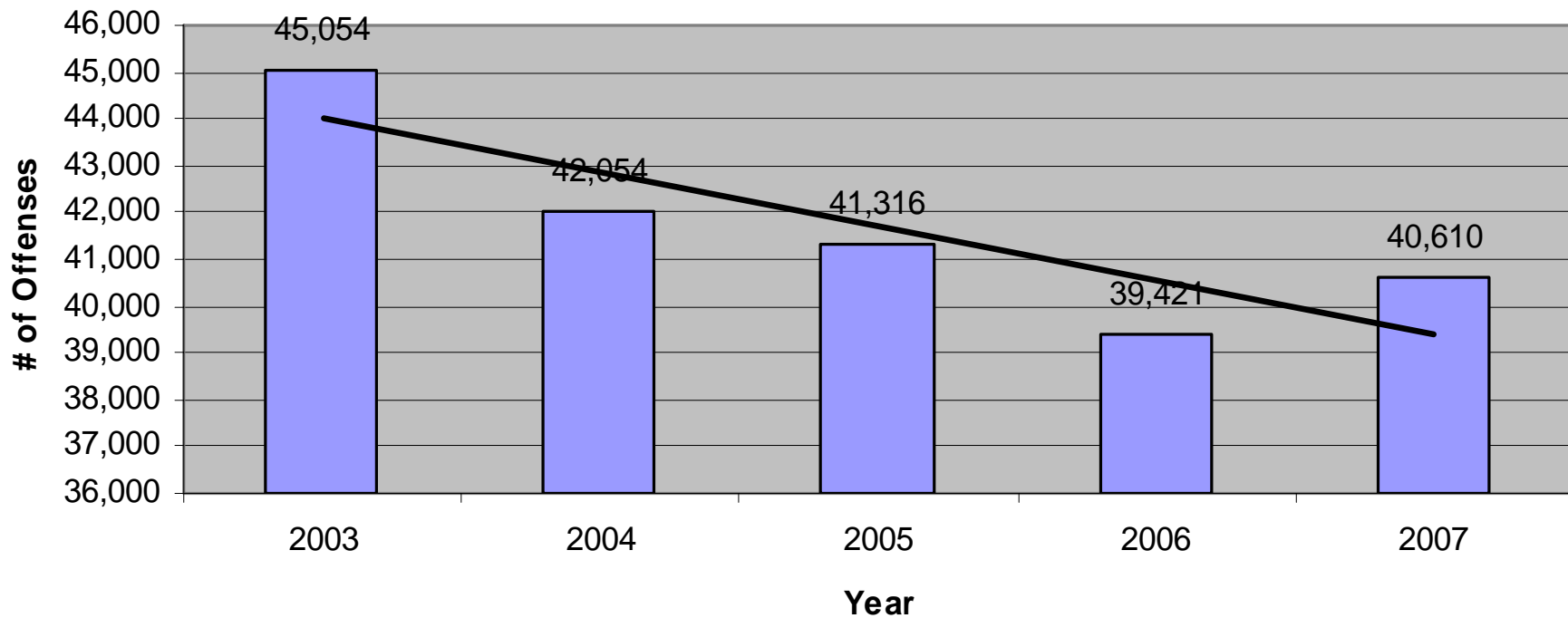
Part 1 Offenses by Region 2003-2007

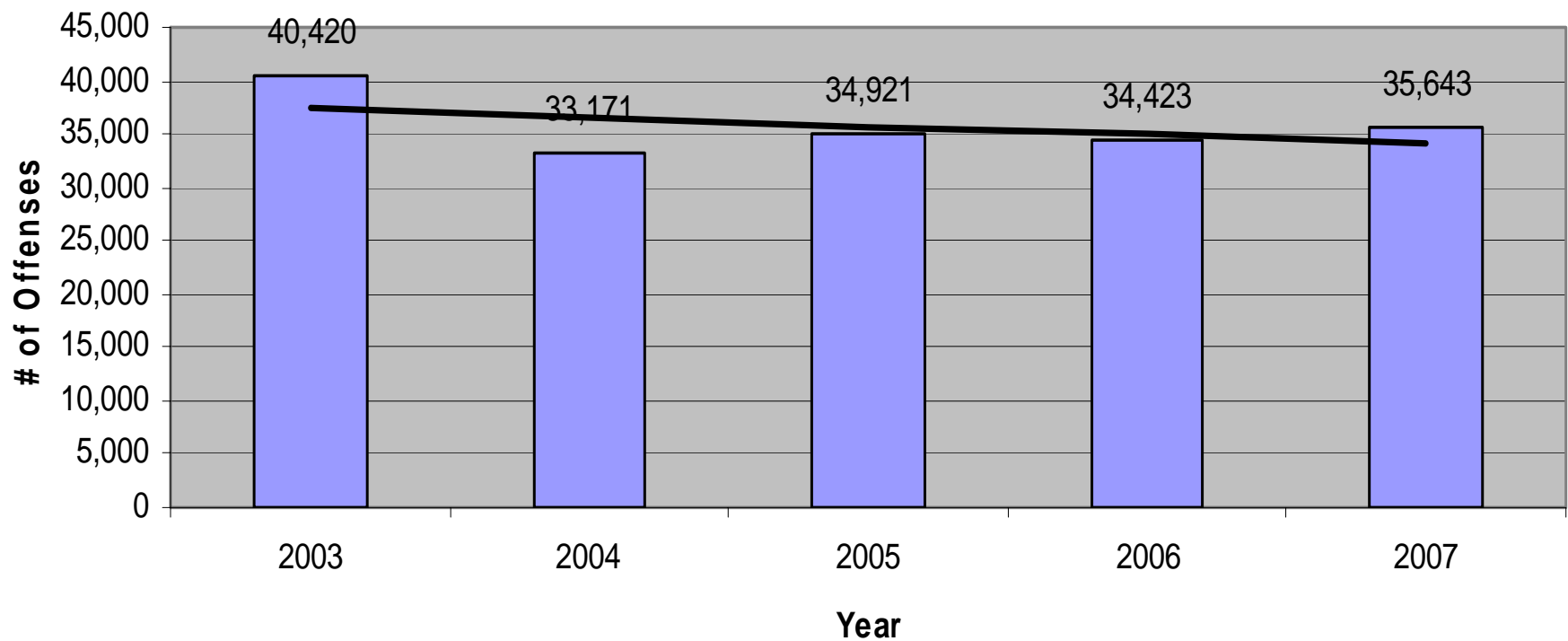
VA Part 1 Offense Trend 2003-2007

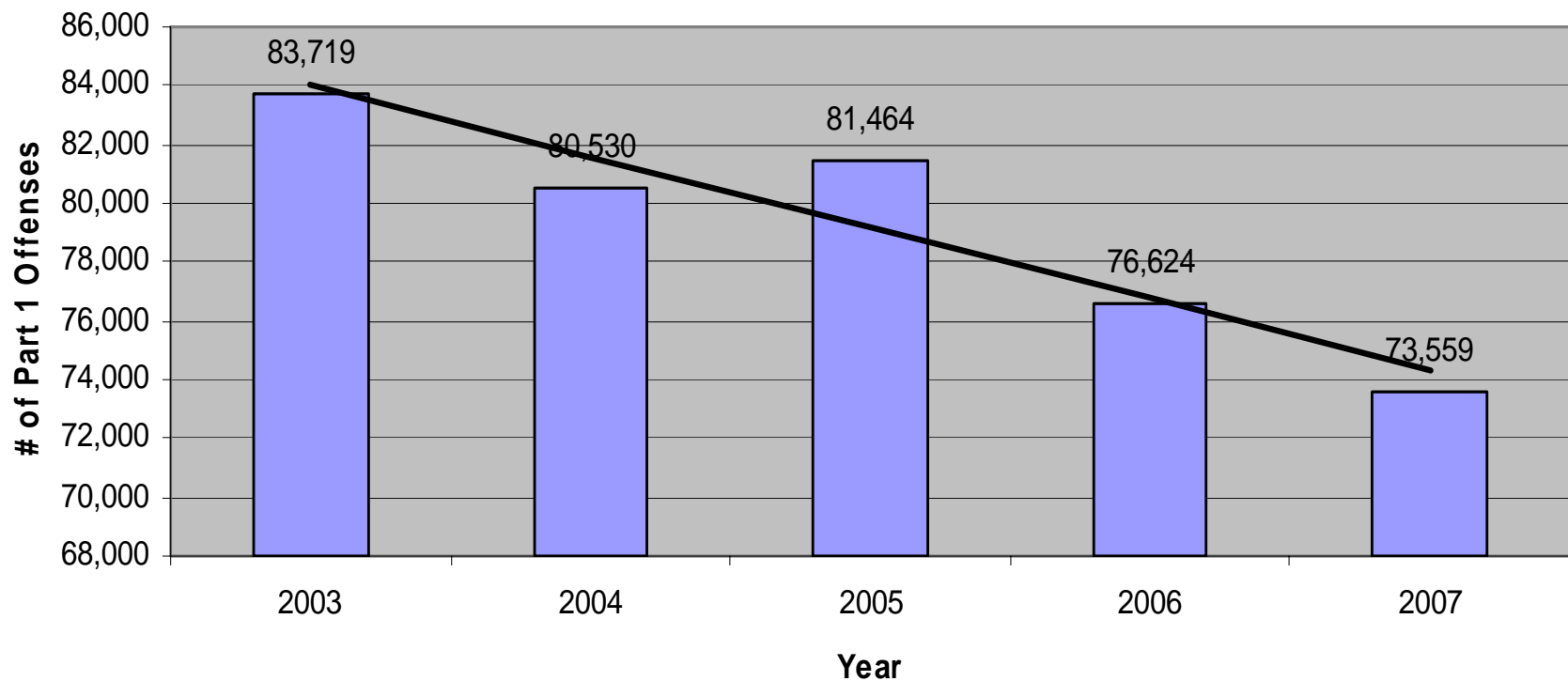
DC Part 1 Offense Trend 2003-2007

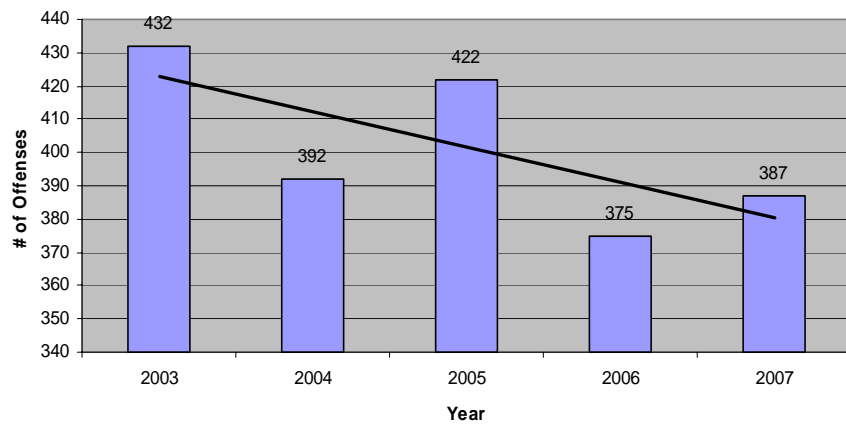

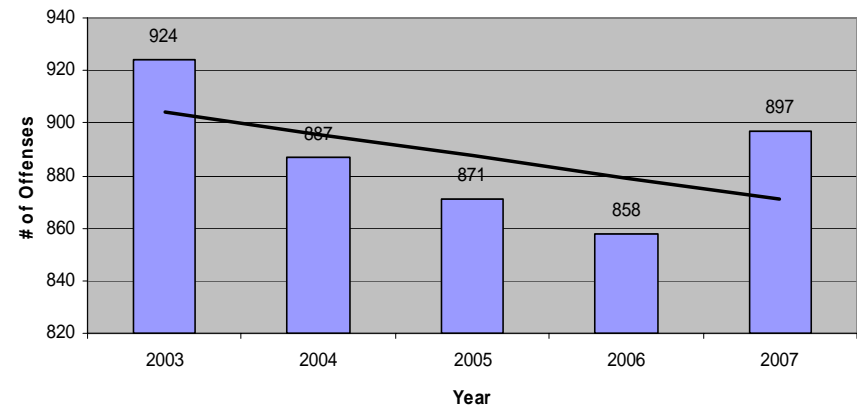


Violent Crime Trends 2003-2007

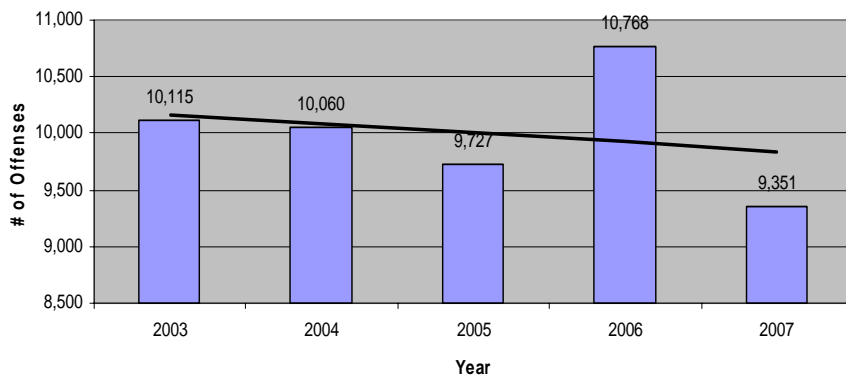
Homicide Trend 2003-2007



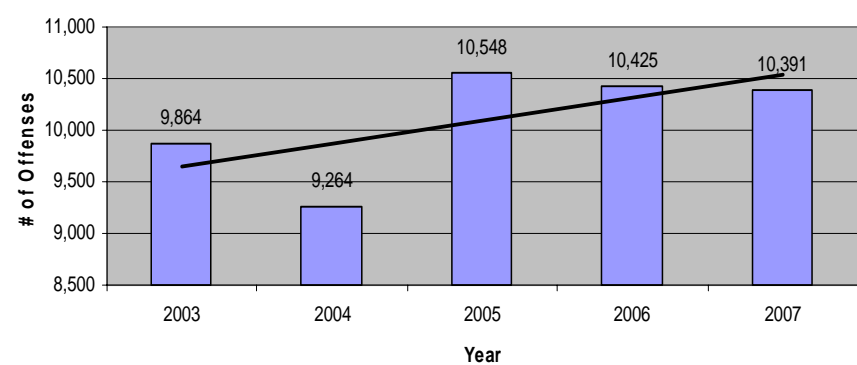
Rape Trend 2003-2007



Aggravated Assault Trend 2003-2007

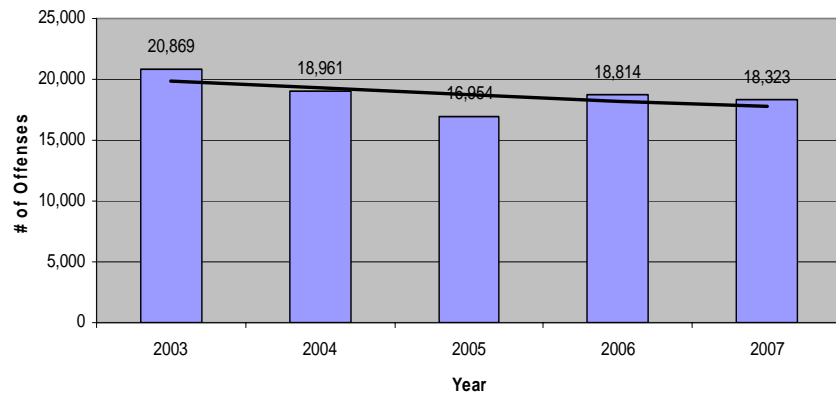


Robbery Trend 2003-2007

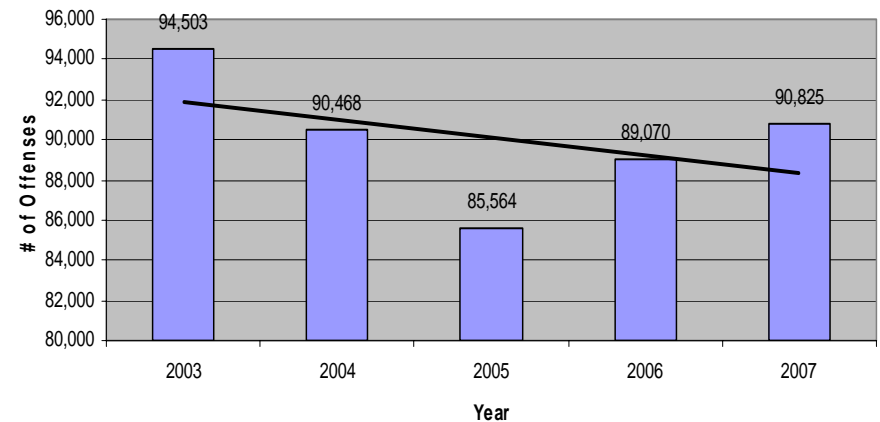


Property Crime Trends 2003-2007

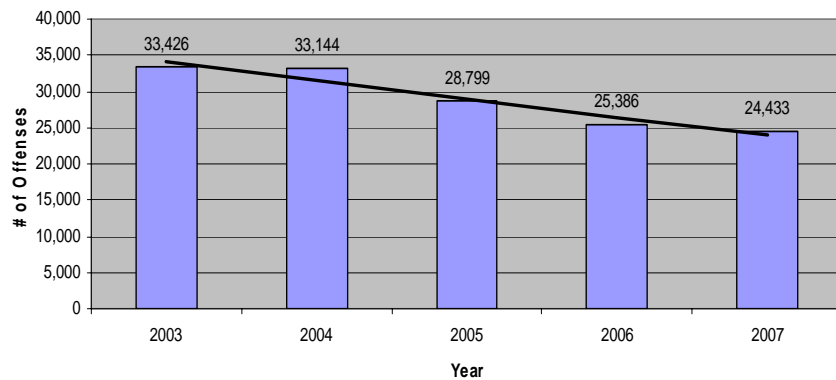
Burglary Trend 2003-2007
