Status report on the consultantassisted project for development of the COG/TPB travel demand model

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Background

- Consultant-assistance project, a.k.a. the model scanning project is now in its tenth year
- Purpose
 - Assist COG/TPB staff in development and application of COG/TPB travel demand model
 - Perform scans of current modeling practice
 - Help ensure that COG/TPB travel model is consistent with state of the practice



Background

- Contract is generally re-bid every three years
 - Latest re-bidding was for FY 15
 - □ Cambridge Systematics, Inc. (CS) won the contract
- After award of contract, task orders are negotiated between COG and consultant
 - COG/TPB staff make proposal to consultant
 - Consultant responds with proposed scope of work, budget, and schedule
 - Once both parties are comfortable with task order,
 COG authorizes consultant to begin work



Background

- Project is off to a slower start this year than is normally the case
- Status of FY 15 task orders

	Description	Status
15.1	Attend relevant meetings and respond to ad-hoc requests	Authorized 7/17/14, \$35k
15.2	Develop a strategic plan for models development	Under development
15.3	Review of transit modeling w.r.t. FTA guidance	Authorized 10/22/14, \$28k



Motivation

- FTA's New Starts and Small Starts program
 - FTA's primary grant program for funding major transit capital investments, including rapid rail, LRT, BRT, commuter rail, and ferries
 - In July 2012, new legislation (MAP-21) was enacted that changed several aspects of the program

- Motivation (continued)
 - COG/TPB does not conduct New Starts or Small Starts studies, but our model gets used by those who do
 - Although Ver. 2.3 model has been out for a while, it appeared that many consultants continued to use Ver.
 2.2 for New Starts work
 - We wanted CS to review features of the Ver. 2.3 model that would need to be changed or added to conform to FTA guidance



Tasks

- Review documentation for the latest version of the TPB model (2.3.57);
- Review the latest FTA guidance on ridership forecasting for New Starts and Small Starts;
- Discuss the potential companion use of the FTA
 Simplified Trips-on-Project Software (STOPS); and
- Propose options and recommendations for addressing the FTA guidance



- Schedule: About 3 months
- Status: CS has just started, so there is nothing to report at this time.

- Last strategic plan for models development at COG
 - Occurred over 20 years ago (1993 by PB)
 - 7-year plan (FY 1993-1999)
- Intervening years
 - TRB review (2003-2004)
 - Consultant scan project (2005 to present)
 - But no formal strategic plan



- 2012: COG/TPB staff undertook a comprehensive review of all the consultant recommendations from first 6 years
 - Goal: Document the TPB staff response to the consultant recommendations
 - TPB Staff Review of Six Years of Consultant Recommendations from the Ongoing Consultant-Assisted Project for Models Development (NCRTPB, MWCOG, July 19, 2012)



- COG/TPB staff proposed getting CS to help develop a new strategic plan (meeting on 8/1/14 and a memo dated 8/1/14)
- □ CS sent a proposal to COG/TPB staff dated 9/17/14
- Since COG's Dept. of Transportation Planning (DTP) has a new director, the legacy staff wanted to
 - Bring the new director up to speed about the scanning contract, in general
 - Discuss the plan for Task Order 15.2, in particular, to make sure that there was buy-in from the director



- Several internal meetings were held
- Based on these meetings, staff chose to revised the proposed scope of this task order
- COG/TPB staff is putting the revised proposal into written form, to share with CS
- Once CS has had a chance to review the new COG proposal, CS will prepare a revised proposed scope of work, budget, and schedule



Side note related to strategic plan

- WMATA sent a letter, dated 10/30/14, to TPB chair advocating for several updates to the regional travel demand model regarding transit, walking, and biking
- 11/19/14: TPB chair indicated that, given its technical nature, COG staff should respond to the letter
- COG/TPB staff is working on a response, and plans to meet with WMATA technical staff in the future
- Staff views these suggestions as important input to the strategic plan



Carry-over work from FY 14

- At the end of the last fiscal year, AECOM sent COG/TPB staff a revised version of the regional model, which included new proposed procedures for modeling HOT lanes and performing toll setting
- COG/TPB staff has been reviewing the revised modeling scripts and running/testing the new procedures to assess their viability
- COG/TBP staff sent memo to AECOM on 9/25/14 and had a follow-up conference call the next day
- Toll setting model runs have varied from 30 hours to over 30 days, depending on values of parameters
- We plan to update the TFS in the future



Next steps

- □ Task Order 15.2
 - COG/TPB staff will send revised proposal to CS
 - CS will respond with a revised scope of work & budget
- COG/TPB staff will continue testing AECOM's proposed modeling enhancements (HOT lane & toll setting)
- Once budget for Task Order 15.2 has been set,
 COG/TPB staff plans to propose one or more FY 15 task orders
