Presentation: Building Code Energy Efficiency Enhancements -- Local Government Support of the "30% Solution" to Strengthen Building Energy Codes</p> <p>IGBG and EAC will be asked to evaluate International Code Council's (ICC's) proposed 2012 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC) and the current state of building codes and code enforcement regionally. Among the action to be considered are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Endorse the proposed 2012 IECC; • Encourage jurisdictions to join the Energy Efficient Codes Coalition (whose members include ICLEI and NASEO) and to send to as many reps as possible to Charlotte in Oct. 2010 to vote for the proposed 2012 IECC • Encourage member jurisdictions to green their codes and to quickly adopt codes which are at least as green as the 2012 IECC codes • Encourage member jurisdictions to increase funding and resources for building energy code compliance, green building training for building officials and code enforcement • Encourage member jurisdictions to coordinate their efforts with each other. <p>Mr. Majersik will provide a brief synopsis on action to date on the 2012 IECC proposal.
