RESOLUTION ON AMENDMENTS TO THE INTERIM FY 2004-2009
TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) AND FY 2003-2008 TIP THAT
ARE EXEMPT FROM THE AIR QUALITY CONFORMITY REQUIREMENT
TO ADD FUNDING TO STUDY A LIMITED ACCESS PLAN
FOR ROUTE 7 IN LEESBURG AS REQUESTED BY THE
VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (VDOT)

WHEREAS, the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board (TPB), which is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the Washington Region, has the responsibility under the provisions of the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21) for developing and carrying out a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process for the Metropolitan Area; and

WHEREAS, on July 17, 2002 the TPB adopted the Constrained Long-Range Transportation Plan (CLRP) and the FY 2003-2008 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); and

WHEREAS, on November 19, 2003, the TPB adopted the Interim 2003CLRP and the Interim FY 2004-2009 TIP; and

WHEREAS, in the attached letter of December 1, 2003, VDOT has requested an amendment to the FY 2003-2008 TIP to add \$2,735,000 in National Corridor Planning and Development Program funding in FY 2004 to study a limited access plan for Route 7 between Route 9 and West Market Street in Leesburg, as described in the attached materials; and

WHEREAS, this project is exempt from the air quality conformity requirement, as defined in Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations "40 CFR Parts 51 and 93 Transportation Conformity Rule Amendments: Flexibility and Streamlining; Final Rule," issued in the August 15, 1997 *Federal Register*,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Program Committee of the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board amends the InterimFY2004-2009 TIP and the FY2003-2008 TIP to add \$2,735,000 in National Corridor Planning and Development Program funding in FY 2004 to study a limited access plan for Route 7 between Route 9 and West Market Street in Leesburg, as described in the attached materials.
