I. Introduction

The following report contains information collected through the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments 2001 Housing Data Survey. The Housing Data Survey is conducted at the beginning of each year and requests data from the previous calendar year (January to December). This report provides a snapshot of regional assisted/ subsidized housing program activity for 2001.

The 2001 Housing Data Survey was distributed to representatives of nine jurisdictions in the metropolitan Washington area. Survey questions were designed to collect general information (for example, area population, number of housing units and average home sale price), as well as more detailed information concerning the region's assisted and subsidized housing programs (e.g., public housing units and Housing Choice Voucher assistance programs). Unless otherwise noted, data are current as of December 2001. Copies of the survey and associated data tables are included at the end of the report.

Demographic data was collected from Census 2000 and Census 1990 data sets.


II. Population

Total population in the region grew by 14 percent between 1990 and 2000 from 3,505,291 persons to 3,995,189. Loudoun County was the fastest growing jurisdiction with population increasing 96.9 percent during the past decade. Fairfax County attracted the largest number of people, adding 151,165 persons to their jurisdiction. The District of Columbia lost 34,841 people during this period, or 5.7 percent of its population during the 1990s.

Share of Regional Population, 2000¹





Population growth was greatest in Northern Virginia, increasing 23.8 percent between 1990 and 2000 to 1,748,274. Population growth in suburban Maryland jurisdictions increased approximately 12.7 percent or 188,561. Northern Virginia residents now account for the majority of the region's population (44 percent) followed by suburban Maryland (42 percent) and the District of Columbia (14 percent).

III. Households


The number of households in the region increased by 8,589 (0.7 percent) between 1990 and 2000. Loudoun County and Prince William County experienced the largest growth rate in the number of households (95.1 percent and 35.7 percent respectively) during this period. The largest absolute increase in households occurred in Fairfax County, where an additional 58,414 households were created over the past 10 years.

IV. Housing Units

During the 1990s, 183,154 units were added to the region's housing stock, a 13 percent increase. Most of the new units were built in the Northern Virginia region (115,601 units) with the remainder (71,197 units) located in suburban Maryland. The District of Columbia's housing stock decreased by 3,644 units (1.3 percent) during this same period.

V. Tenure

According to Census 2000, occupied housing units in the region totaled 1,517,409. Of these, 61.3 percent (930,377) were owner-occupied and 38.7 percent (587,032) were renter-occupied. The number of owner-occupied units in the area increased by 19.5 percent, while the number of renter-occupied units grew by 8.7 percent.

VI. Assisted Rental Housing

A total of 88,771 assisted rental units are located in the metropolitan Washington region. Many (41 percent) of these units are located within the District of Columbia. Assisted rental units account for 15.1 percent of the total occupied rental units in the region.


Public Housing Units

Public housing units comprise 16.2 percent of the assisted housing stock in the region, for a total of 13,289 units. The District of Columbia houses the largest number of public housing residents (9,076) while Arlington, Loudoun and Prince Williams Counties, as well as the City of Falls Church, do not have any public housing units within their jurisdictions.



Housing Choice Vouchers

Over 25,000 households (25,323) receive rental assistance in the form of Housing Choice Vouchers. Tenant-based vouchers make up the bulk of assistance (99.4 percent) with the remaining 130 vouchers ear-marked for project-based assistance.






Section 8 Units

New construction/Substantial rehab units number 18,110 in the region. Moderate rehab units total 2,406. Section 8 units account for 25.7 percent of the total assisted rental units in the region.





VII. Affordable Sales Housing

A total of 33,440 households (or 6.4 percent of owner-occupied units) received homebuyer assistance as of December 2001. Montgomery County's Moderately Priced Dwelling Unit program accounted for 9.9 percent of home purchases in the jurisdiction from January through December 2001.



VIII. Special Needs Housing

Overall, 1,379 special needs housing facilities (with 16,076 beds) are located throughout the region. Over half (56.8 percent) of these units receive local government funding².
