# Background

- Received 108 FY15 proposal requests totaling approximately \$63M
- NCR will receive \$54M in FY15 UASI funding (\$43.2M is 80% pass through)
- In February, SPG-CAO HSEC approved \$25.2M in long-term sustainment proposals
- On May 6, 2015, the SPG-CAO HSEC approved the remaining \$18M
- Projects that were deferred for FY15 will remain on an ongoing prioritization list

# Characteristics of FY15 Regional UASI Proposals

- Address a critical gap, initiate or complete a capability, or retain a baseline capability
- Ability to demonstrate impact and benefit to the NCR
- Time-sensitive/level of urgency to initiate in FY15
- Strategically sound and well-designed to achieve desired results

# Focus of FY15 Proposals

- The approved proposals focus on three primary functions:
  - **Improve:** Address deficiencies that could impede the region's ability to respond effectively
  - **Develop:** Initiate or complete regional capabilities
  - **Retain:** Sustain critical baseline capabilities to avoid a loss in capability

# Proposed FY15 Regional Capability Priorities

- Ability to detect, interdict or deter threats
- Integrated regional planning, training and operational coordination
- Information sharing systems for making informed decisions
- Regional interoperability during mutual aid responses
- Protection of first responders
- Detection, response to and recovery from CBRNE/HAZMAT incidents
- Provision of food and shelter to survivors after an incident
- Continuity of operations among healthcare workers
- Volunteer and donations management program
- Capability assessment and coordination of homeland security activities

- SAA and PMO to work with proposal leads to ensure grants are ready to be executed upon award
