## **ACTION ITEMS**

Chairman Zimmerman will announce the appointment of a Nominating Committee for year 2005 TPB officers. The TPB Bylaws provide for TPB officers to serve for one calendar year, from January 1 through December 31. The Nominating Committee will be asked to present a slate of year 2005 officers for action by the Board at its December 15 meeting.

The Association of Metropolitan Planning Organizations (AMPO) is a national organization that represents and provides assistance to metropolitan planning organizations like the TPB throughout the United States. Vice Chairman Mendelson is a member of the Board of Directors of AMPO.

**Action:** Approve funding of \$16,875 from the FY 2005 UPWP along with an associated transmittal letter for the TPB's 2005 membership in AMPO.

At the October 20 TPB meeting, the Board adopted Resolution R3-2005 declaring funding must be identified to meet the preservation, rehabilitation, and capacity expansion needs of the Metrorail and Metrobus system. In February 2001 and in February 2004, the TPB published brochures which document the funding crisis facing the region's transportation system. The Board will be asked to adopt Resolution R5-2005 to declare that funding must be identified to meet the preservation, rehabilitation, and capacity expansion needs of the region's highways, local transit, and commuter rail systems.

The Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) has requested an amendment to the FY 2004-2009 TIP and the draft FY 2005-2010 TIP to include recently committed funding to support WMATA's rehabilitation and maintenance needs; rail capacity growth to accommodate demand by minor fleet expansion

and associated facilities upgrades; and bus fleet capacity growth by minor fleet expansion, garage facilities and customer facilities and a security program including a backup operations control center.

**Action:** Adopt Resolution R6-2005 to amend the FY 2004-2009 TIP and the draft FY 2005-2010 TIP as requested by WMATA.
