## CAPTURING THE IMPACTS OF TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS ON DISADVANTAGED POPULATIONS)

To support the implementation of a Regional Equity Strategy, staff at the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) are experimenting with different approaches to measure equity and identify trends in disparity gaps. In this presentation, we will discuss person- and place-based measures as well as recent explorations using a synthetic population to measure current conditions. We will bring forth questions about incorporating some techniques into forecast models where feasible.
