Ridership / Fare Data

- Ridership continued to decline across all services in Jan / Feb
- Range of ridership change varied most with service providers who resumed fare collection.
- Median ridership change was lowest for services that resumed fare collection during the first few months.
- Service providers who always collected fares experienced the highest increases in ridership during March.
