

MEETING NOTES CAR FREE DAY STEERING COMMITTEE Wednesday September 12, 2012

1. Introductions

Committee members, guests and other attendees introduced themselves by name and affiliation.

2. Approval of Minutes

The meeting notes from the July 11, 2012 meeting were approved as written.

3. Posters/Buttons

The "Park It" poster depicting a car with family-oriented weekend activities and transportation modes was distributed by the beginning of August. The same graphics were incorporated into the web site, Twitter and facebook sites. A handful of extra posters were made available at the meeting along with buttons for Committee members to take.

4. Radio/Press Releases

"Just Park It" was the draft radio script selected by the Committee among a choice of three. The 60-second radio ad was produced and began airing the week of September 3rd and will continue through Sept 21. In the radio spot, a young boy announces that he's taking back his weekend and encourages his mom to forgo running errands on Saturday. He recommends instead, to Metro to a museum etc. The finished radio spot was played for the Committee.

Two press releases have been sent out to date, August 15th announcing the web site was open for pledges, and on September 10th, a release referenced high gas prices and provided a list of prizes being raffled off to those who pledged to be car free or car-lite.
