Update on Greater Washington 2050 Initiative

On May 30th, the Greater Washington 2050 Initiative held its fourth work session in COG's Board of Directors Room. The Coalition was briefed about the Climate Change Steering Committee and proposed findings and recommendations to be advanced in July to the COG Board of Directors, including significant reductions in greenhouse gas emissions and implementation steps. Coalition members were encouraged by the proposed COG actions and urged several additional measures to incorporate energy costs and availability and climate change in Greater Washington 2050's ongoing work. The Coalition organized four task forces to work on specific projects or deliverables ---Planning Principles; Planning Tools; Compact; and Communications and Outreach. COG staff will update the Committee on next steps involving the PDTAC.

In May, the PDTAC received a briefing from TPB staff regarding the development of the Aspiration Scenario. At the direction of the TPB Scenario Task Force, the Planning Directors are being asked to comment on the proposed CLRP Aspiration Scenario. TPB staff prepared a series of spreadsheets and maps at the jurisdictional level detailing the shift in households and employment at the TAZ level for the scenario.
