Call to Order (Jeff King)

Approval of December 15, 2011 Meeting Summary

No action was taken on the December 15th Meeting Summary. Action deferred.

Collaborative Solar Procurement

COG members and other stakeholders in the region are actively working with the US
 EPA Green Power Partnership on a collaborative effort to procure solar PV. Over 170
 sites were screened with 80 potential locations for a total energy capacity of nearly
 45MW evaluated in preparation for release of a strategically bundled Request for
 Proposal. The next step is the review of agency-specific feasibility studies in preparation
 for the release of an RFP for the identified sites.

Dominion Renewable Energy Programs

- In addition to its existing efforts on renewable energy, Dominion has proposed new renewable energy programs to the SCC. Program implementation will commence upon SCC approval. Three main programs will include a large commercial solar deployment initiative, a pilot on strategic siting of solar to address grid congestion and better understand system impacts, and a special solar tariff. Four systems will be installed in community settings. The new solar tariff will be an alternative to net metering and will be impacted by level of subscribers willing to participate.
- Dominion effort to site new wind generation is meeting with some local opposition.
- Dominion is getting federal assistance on offshore wind development.

QECBs

• James Barrett provided an overview of the issues of concern related to Qualified Energy Conservation Bonds (QECBs). QECBs are a very low cost way to finance energy projects; however, most of the funding allocated to the program remains untapped. There is an effort underway to try to get the Executive Branch/IRS to issue clarifying guidance to remove some uncertainties and barriers that may be preventing more widespread use of QECBs. The main issues are requirements for a 20% reduction in energy and definition of green community programs. There is also interest in trying to consolidate funding between different communities.

CEEPC Progress Report

• COG staff are circulating the annual survey to collect information needed to complete the CEEPC progress report.

State Legislative Priorities

 COG staff referred members to legislative priorities document in the handouts. COG will be working to track legislation and may prepare comment letters through the CEEPC Advocacy Committee.
