An expert land use panel has been convened as part of the Inter-County Connector (ICC) Corridor Study being conducted by the Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA). The ICC Expert Land Use Panel has been tasked with estimating the differences in the amount and location of future household and job growth for the ICC alternatives being evaluated in this study (including a no-build alternative). The results of the panel's work will be incorporated into the ICC Environmental Impact Statement (ICC EIS). Staff will report on the five Expert Panel meetings held to-date, the final results of the panel's work and how the results of the Expert Panel's work might be used in the feedback to the Round 6.4 Cooperative Forecasts.

During its April meeting, the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board (TPB) approved the proposed scope of work for the Air Quality Conformity Analysis of the 2004 Constrained Long-Range Plan (CLRP) and 2005-2010 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), as well as the local transportation project submissions. Included in the local transportation projects are two proposed alignments for the Inter-County Connector (ICC). In May, PDTAC members were asked to consider the potential impacts of the ICC on the Round 6.4 Cooperative Forecasts. Mr. Kirby will discuss the relationship of the CLRP and TIP process to the updated Round 6.4 Cooperative Forecasts and update Committee members on the schedule for completing the Air Quality Conformity Analysis.
