 - Coordinated Plan guides project selection and includes evaluation Criteria



Projects Funded 2007 to 2011

JARC

- 25 projects
- + \$5.3 million in Federal funds
- \$9 million total

New Freedom

- 24 projects
- + \$4.5 million in Federal funds
- \$6.3 million total


One joint JARC and New Freedom project (WMATA) (travel training)

- \$987,000 in Federal funds (\$1.2 million total)(70% JARC; 30% New Freedom)



Types of Projects


- Breakdown of 50 projects funded from 2007 – 2011
 - 5 Travel Training
 - 12 Enhanced Access (Bus Stops Improvements, Bike Sharing pilot, Door through Door service)
 - 8 Vouchers
 - 8 Fixed Route / Demand Response
 - 6 Car Loans
 - 5 Accessible Cabs
 - 6 Planning / Promotional Activities

2013 Solicitation Details

Solicitation Details

- February 7 through April 17
- Funding amounts
 - JARC: \$1.3 million
 - New Freedom: \$728,000
 - Matching Funds required (20% capital; 50% operating)

Outreach

- Approximately 1,500 organizations received electronic brochure
- Four pre-application conferences
 - 1 in MD, 1 in VA, 2 in DC



Solicitation Priorities

- Priorities developed by the Task Force for the 2013 Solicitation
 - Taxi Vouchers
 - Low Interest Car Loan Programs
 - Travel Training
 - Wheelchair Accessible Taxis



Selection Process

- 2 Selection Committees: 1 for JARC, 1 for New Freedom
- Both chaired by TPB Member Patrick Wojahn
- Applications scored using selection criteria established in Coordinated Plan
- Each Committee met twice in May
- Committee members represented local public transit, workforce development, and disability issues
- Funding recommendations will be presented to TPB for final approval on June 19, following review by TPB Officers
- Applicants notified on June 13



MAP-21 Enhanced Mobility Program

- In March, TPB sent a formal request to be designated the recipient to the Governors and Mayor
- \$2.8 million apportioned to the Washington DC-VA-MD Urbanized Area for FY13
- Eligible projects and recipients similar to the New Freedom program
- Human Service Transportation Coordination Task
 Force will meet in the Fall to update the
 Coordinated Plan
- Solicitation for Projects Anticipated between January and April 2014
