- Value & Purpose of the proposed Potomac Watershed Water Monitoring Forum:
 - Present and document ongoing WQ monitoring activities
 - o Inform the full spectrum of interested parties regarding these activities
 - o Identify needs, priorities and funding issues
 - Data gathering
 - Reporting
 - Funding
 - Eliminate any duplications; determine opportunities for efficiencies through combined efforts
 - Provide an opportunity to see vendor products

 - Public Health & Public Safety (e.g., water utility source protection; water security; bacteria; swimming safety; fish consumption safety)
 - Restoration Monitoring (e.g., nutrient & sediment loads related to Bay program and other goals)
 - Stream Assessment

 - Universities
 - o NGOs: Watershed Associations and Advocacy Groups
 - Citizens groups
