### **MEMORANDUM**

- **RE:** Steering Committee Actions

At its meeting of September 4, 2009, the TPB Steering Committee approved the following resolutions:

- TPB SR1-2010 on an Amendment to the FY 2010-2015 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) that is exempt from the Air Quality Conformity Requirement to include funding for PRTC's Commuter Assistance Program and Western Maintenance Facility and for the extension of the platform at VRE's Lorton Station and a Parking Garage at the VRE's Broad Run Station, as requested by the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT).
- TPB SR2-2010 on an Amendment to the FY 2010 -2015 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) that is exempt from the Air Quality Conformity Requirement to reduce funding on various roads, bridges, and trails and bikeways, as requested by Frederick County.

The TPB Bylaws provide that the Steering Committee "shall have the full authority to approve non-regionally significant items, and in such cases it shall advise the TPB of its action."

### RESOLUTION ON AMENDMENT TO THE FY 2010- 2015 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) THAT IS EXEMPT FROM THE AIR QUALITY CONFORMITY REQUIREMENT TO INCLUDE FUNDING FOR PRTC'S COMMUTER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM AND WESTERN MAINTENANCE FACILITY AND FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE PLATFORM AT VRE'S LORTON STATION AND A PARKING GARAGE AT VRE'S BROAD RUN STATION, AS REQUESTED BY THE VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (VDOT)

**WHEREAS,** the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board (TPB), which is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the Washington Region, has the responsibility under the provisions of Safe, Accountable, Flexible, and Efficient Transportation Equity Act - A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) for developing and carrying out a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process for the Metropolitan Area; and

WHEREAS, on July 15, 2009 the TPB adopted the FY 2010-2015 TIP; and

**WHEREAS,** in the attached letter of August 28, 2009 VDOT has requested an amendment to the FY 2010-2015 TIP to include \$300,000 Congestion Management and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ) funding for a Commuter Assistance Program for Prince William County, and the cities of Manassas and Manassas Park, and \$1 million in CMAQ funding to construct the Western Maintenance Facility, and \$250,000 in CMAQ funds to extend the platform at VRE's Lorton Station, and \$1.42 million to construct a parking garage at VRE's Broad Run Station in Prince William County as described in the attached materials; and

**WHEREAS**, the four transit projects are exempt from the air quality conformity requirement, as defined in Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations "40 CFR Parts 51 and 93 Transportation Conformity Rule Amendments: Flexibility and Streamlining; Final Rule," issued in the May 6, 2005, *Federal Register;* 

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Steering Committee of the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board amends the FY 2010-2015 TIP to include \$300,000 Congestion Management and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ) funding for a Commuter Assistance Program for Prince William County, and the cities of Manassas and Manassas Park, and \$1 million in CMAQ funding to construct the Western Maintenance Facility, and \$250,000 in CMAQ funds to extend the platform at VRE's Lorton Station, and \$1.42 million to construct a parking garage at VRE's Broad Run Station in Prince William County, as described in the attached materials.

Dear Chairman Jenkins:

On behalf of the Potomac and Rappahannock Transportation Commission (PRTC) and the Virginia Railway Express (VRE), VDOT's Northern Virginia District Office requests amending the FY 2010-2015 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to reflect project funding updates. These projects are already included in the current conformity analysis, or are conformity exempt transit projects for the TIP. The changes proposed to the 2010-2015 TIP are indicated in boldface on the attached spreadsheet and are outlined below.

- <u>PRTC Commuter Assistance Program (UPC T1833)</u>. This project will provide comprehensive transit commute matching services to Prince William County and the Cities of Manassas Park. The proposed amendment will add \$0.300 M in the preliminary engineering phase in FY 2010 using CMAQ funds.
- <u>PRTC Western Maintenance Facility (UPC 85382)</u>. This project involves construction of PRTC's Western Maintenance Facility and Storage Yard. The proposed amendment will add \$1.00 M in the right-of way phase in FY 2010 using CMAQ funds.
- <u>VRE Lorton Station Platform Extension (UPC T8522)</u>. This project will lengthen the existing platform from 400 feet to 650 feet and extend the canopy 100 feet. The proposed

amendment will add \$0.250 M in the preliminary engineering and construction phases in FY 2010 using CMAQ funds.

• <u>VRE Broad Run Station Parking Garage (UPC T8523)</u>. This project will add a three or four story parking structure at Broad Run VRE Station with a net gain of up to 985 spaces for a total of approximately 1,870 spaces. The proposed amendment will add \$1.420 M to the preliminary engineering phase in FY2010 using CMAQ funds.

VDOT requests that this TIP Amendment be presented at the September 4, 2009 TPB Steering Committee for their review and action.

The Potomac & Rappahannock Transportation Commission (PRTC) requests project amendments to the <u>FY 2010-2015 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)</u> to reflect project funding updates. These projects are already accounted for in the current conformity analysis, or are conformity-exempt transit projects for the TIP. The changes we wish to be made to the FY2010-2015 TIP are indicated in boldface in the attached spreadsheet and are outlined below:

- <u>PRTC Commuter Assistance Program (UPCT1833)</u>. This project will provide comprehensive transit commute matching services to Prince William County and the Cities of Manassas and Manassas Park. The proposed amendment will add \$300K in the preliminary engineering phase in FY2010 using Federal CMAQ funds.
- <u>PRTC Western Maintenance Facility (UPC85382)</u>. This project involves construction of PRTC's Western Maintenance Facility and Storage Yard. The proposed amendment will add \$1,000K in the right-of-way phase in FY2010 using Federal CMAQ funds.
- <u>VRE Lorton Station Platform Extension (NEW)</u>. This project will lengthen the existing platform from 400 feet to 650 feet and extend the canopy 100 feet as well.
- <u>VRE Broad Run Station Parking Garage (NEW)</u>. This project will add a three or four story parking structure at Broad Run VRE Station with a net gain of up to 985 spaces for a total of approximately 1870 spaces. The proposed amendment will add \$1,420K to the preliminary engineering phase in FY2010 using Federal CMAQ funds.

PRTC and VRE request that the Transportation Planning Board's (TPB) 2010-2015 TIP and VDOT's FY09-12 STIP be amended to reflect the aforementioned changes as project funds must be included in an approved TIP and STIP before PRTC/VRE can access these funds through the Federal Transit Administration grant application process.

On behalf of Frederick County we would like to amend the MWCOG FY2010-2015 TIP to reflect finalized changes to funding as shown in the Frederick County Capital Improvement Program. All of the affected projects are exempt from Air Quality Conformity. The changes reflect project deferrals and associated funding reductions for County Roads, County Bridges and Bikeways & Trails programs. The specific project changes are note below
