10:10 A.M. 3. STORMWATER RESILIENCY: WHAT IS NEEDED FOR THE FUTURE?

A. Back to a more integrated future? What is 'stormwater resiliency' and how does it inform the future of stormwater management?

Mr. Berger will introduce the concept of stormwater resiliency and what it means for present-day and future stormwater management needs, goals, and strategies.

B. Stormwater and climate change research and planning

Mr. Goulet will share an update on the Chesapeake Bay Program's climate change modeling and the Bay Program's plans to update stormwater design curves to meet future storms. Lastly, he will cover the Chesapeake Stormwater Network's plans for its stormwater resiliency research.

C. How are local governments starting to think about stormwater resiliency?
