2006 to 2005 Comparison

- COG Region Part I crime down -4 %
 - Homicide down nearly -12%
 - Motor vehicle thefts down -14.7%
 - Rape down -7.3%
 - Robbery down -5.1%
 - Larceny down -2.6%
 - Violent Crime down -1.4%

2006 FBI Preliminary Crime Estimates

- +1.35% increase in violent crime
- -2.9% decrease in property crime

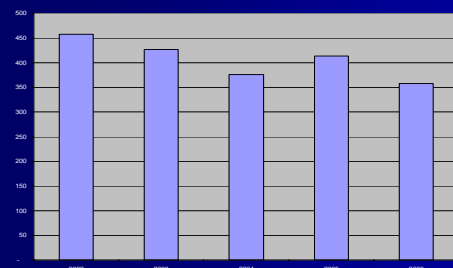
COG Comparison to 2006 FBI Crime Estimates

- Violent crime down -1.4%
- Part I property crime down -4.4%

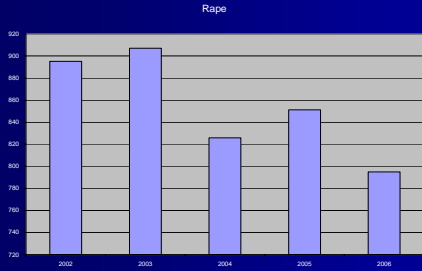
Good News

 - Inter-agency cooperation

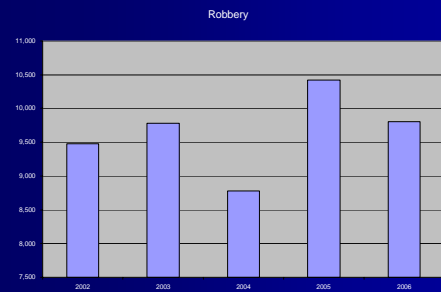
5 Year Homicide Trend



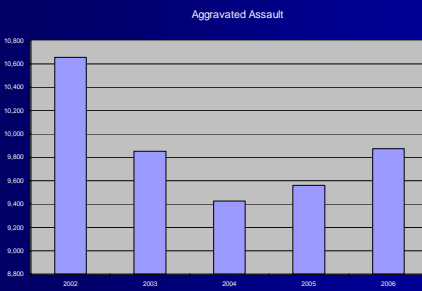
5 Year Rape Trend



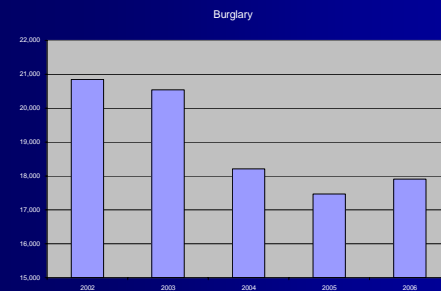
5 Year Robbery Trend



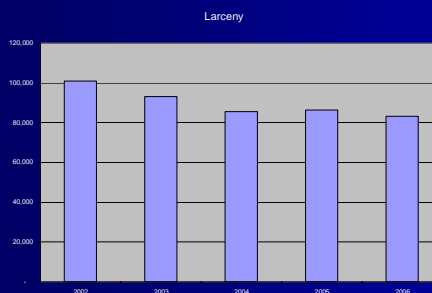
5 Year Aggravated Assault Trend



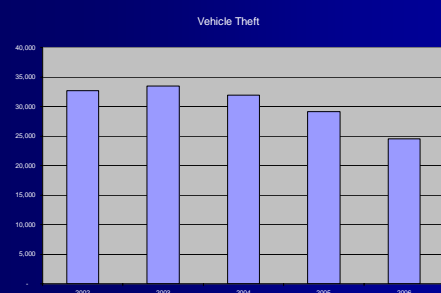
5 Year Burglary Trend



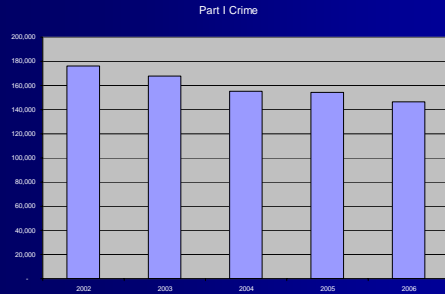
5 Year Larceny Trend



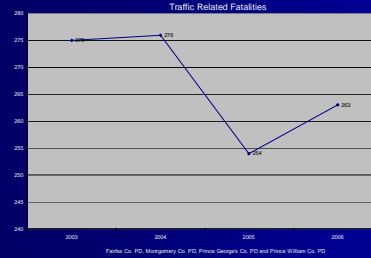
5 Year Vehicle Theft Trend



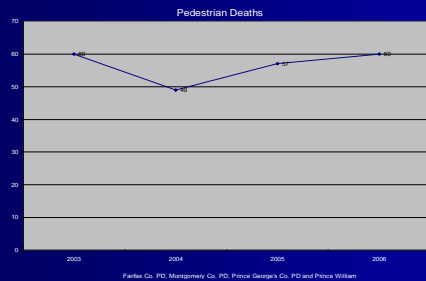

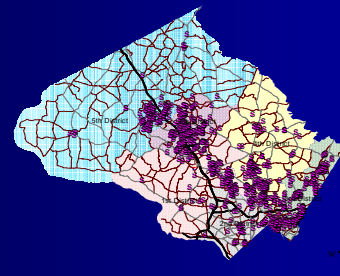
Challenges Facing Participating COG Agencies

 - Theft from vehicles

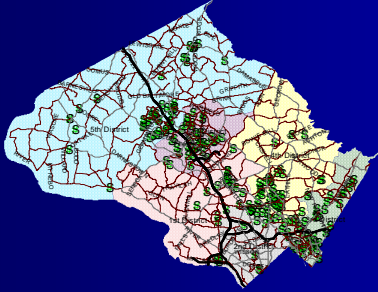

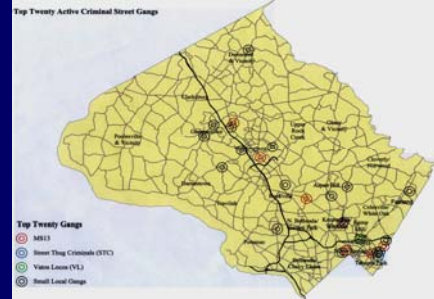
Montgomery County Police 2006 Robberies
