

Intercept 1 Law Enforcement and Emergency Services

6 DBH Crisis Lines
24hrs; 2 suicide lines; 85,000 incoming calls

911 Dispatch
MH calls; ID CIT need (just a few CIT trained)

311 Line- non-crisis

22 ACT Teams
FY15: 194 referrals

Integrate Comm. Care Project
30 people; 7-8/shift

FD 12

Hospitals
St. Elizabeth
State hospital; run by DBH; detox; voluntary; **292/280 ADR**; 60 clients/month; sobering unit missing

Civil Commitment
Pro-consumer; MI; injury related to MI & determine needed; injury to self/others if not committed; petition w/in 7 days

Homeless Outreach Team
Mobile; alert DBH partner- CPEP

175 police agencies

DC Metro PD
3,800 officers; 852 CIT
FD12
PD251C- goes to DBH
40% form voluntary
3,736 tracked to DBH
FY 11-15

CPEP
24/7 eval; hub of system; ALOS 18hrs
68 staff- 11 psych, 12 nurses, 10 SW; serve 3,800/yr (20 at a time); 18hr observation, then hospital or rehab

Mobile Crisis Team: 22 staff; serves 1,300/yr; voluntary

Intercept 2 Initial Detention and Initial Court Hearings

7 Police Districts:
can hold 150 people; US Marshalls have custody

Central Cell Block (CCB)
150 capacity; reduced citation- DOC holding for court (24hrs, unless Sunday- 72hrs); Pre-trial assessment w/in 48hrs (DBH has rep); 17-18 MI/suicide questions; Safe cell available; provider- Unity Health; Medication unstable- taken to hospital/CPEP (4/month); 12hr/7day Clinic Nurse/PA; 16% MH, 6% SUD; Seen 3,100 since 12/2013; EMR- medical history/meds

DC Superior Court Services
Not US District; citation release

Initial Court Hearing
Pre-trial serves 1,300; 30 officers; 24/7 diagnostic unit; arraignment; risk assessment
Treatment Unit- 77 staff
Building Bridges- co-occurring; 25 cap.

Urgent Care Clinic in Int. 2 Court: 1 Psych, 2 SW, 1 Peer Support, 1 Clinical Coord., 2 SA Counselors; voluntary; pre-trial & MH Court refer; link to services & 90day follow-up; 50 served/month for intake services

Options Program
Diversion; helps people get to court and services; 28 served

Cite & Release
Emer. Response team- crisis negotiation training; 7,650 investigators; FY15 6,419 released (84%)

Intercept 3 Jails and Courts

Jail
2 Facilities: Central Detention & Correctional Treatment

CCA run; 650 staff; 1,800 ADP (16% initial SPMI, 25% over time)
Unity Health- med/MH/dental; 9 MH Clinicians; 6 Psychiatrists (1FT); Acute MH Unit (45-60 served, 9wk step-down to stabilize)
Data sharing w/DBH; 3 DBH Liaisons screened 989 people (855 had SPMI, 508 re-linked to DBH services, 255 newly linked)
Detox/Medication Assisted Treatment; staff ID veterans, not much at intake; Medicaid enrollment (80%)

Courts

Drug Court
120 served; pre-trial treatment groups & supervision; felonies; 2 teams/supervisors; 9 PT officers

MH Com. Court
200 served; pre-trial; mostly misdemeanors; Axis 1 MH diagnosis-connect to services; 23 PT officers

Restorative Justice
Community service 4-6mo; case dismissed or vacated; expand to jobs/education

Intercept 4 Reentry

Mayor's Office of Returning Citizen Affairs
Unfunded Mandate; work readiness

BOP Prisons
All over the country

BOP's Reentry Division
Psychology; residential reentry; female/medical facilities have SWs; regional SWs;
Review 120 days from discharge/have monthly calls
Serves 21 people/month; varying acuity levels (group home apps, benefits, housing, MH, medical, link to services)
Reentry Coordinator (DBH)
Ubx from CSOSA- works w/regional SWs
Reentry from BOP from other states by bus/escort; some transport without escort

Jail Reentry

1) DC Linkage Plus Program- 52 new referrals in FY15 (203 persons)
2) "N" Street Village Program- 25 persons in FY15
Unity House has a Reentry Center, has discharge planners & does reentry planning at screening; go to Unity Clinic for treatment at discharge; release from jail = 3 days meds and Rx for 30-day renewal; release from court = 7-10 days meds and Rx; appointments scheduled for MH issues; connected to CSA; work readiness program; Medicaid restarted; DBH pays for core service agencies to go to jail to initiate prior to discharge

Intercept 5 Community Corrections and Community Supports

BOP/CSOSA Partnership
Res. treatment program through DC jail; can serve 45

Supervised Release- CSOSA
BH Supervision Teams: 7 men/3 women (caseloads 40 and under); 3 sex off. Teams; 4 young offender teams

US Parole Commission's Specialized Docket- instead of parole revocation; men/women dockets (1x/month); 348 people so far
Partners: Public Defender Services, DBH, CSOSA; started March 12, 2012

Meet w/ACT Team & Supervision Team when returned to community (DC)

Probation
Mixed caseloads between Parole/Probation; max & intensive risk
Min. risk supervision caseload= 400:1
Some staff w/BH backgrounds; DBH Training Institute; co-occurring training; opt into working w/specialized units
Team: Supervisory CSO; 6-7 CSOs; caseloads= 19-40 people
CSOSA: inpatient residential treatment for SUD issues
Referral to CPEP
