THE REGIONAL ECONOMIC MONITORING SYSTEM (REMS) REPORT – JULY 2023

In June, over-the-year employment increased by 85,200 jobs or 2.6 percent in the Washington Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA), while the national over-the-year employment increased by about 3.7 million jobs or 2.4 percent. Locally, the Leisure & Hospitality Sector gained 19,700 jobs and the Professional & Business Services Sector gained 9,000 jobs during the last year. (373,800 jobs were lost between March 2020 and April 2020) The Washington region has recovered 432,400 jobs between April 2020 and June 2023 – 101.8 percent recovery. The region's inflation decreased in May to 3.1 percent from a rate of 3.7 percent in March. During June, the region's unemployment rate decreased to 2.5 percent, while the national rate increased to 3.8 percent. The 2,081 new housing units authorized during June 2023 represent a 23.8 percent decrease from June 2022, when 2,730 new units were started. 

Unemployment Rate Washington MSA and US





At-Place Employment - The number of jobs within a given area. Although some employment data include the number of areas residents who have jobs, at-place employment counts the actual number of jobs in an area.
