COG Region Population Between 35 and 54 Years Rises 27 Percent

Welcome to the second in a series of COG Census 2000 reports.

The second issue of "Our Changing Region" is based on the Profiles of General Demographic Characteristics from Census 2000, which is the information compiled from the questions asked of all people and about every housing unit. The Profiles of General Demographic Characteristics population items include sex, age, race, Hispanic or Latino, household relationship, household type, group quarters population, housing occupancy, and housing tenure.



The population of the COG region increased nearly 15 percent from 1990 to 2000, totaling 4,211,964 people. There were population increases in almost every age cohort, except for people between 20 to 24 years and 25 to 34 years, which declined by more than 36,000 and 59,000 people, respectively. The greatest increases were within the age cohorts of the prime working years, 35 to 44 years and 45 to 54 years, which added more than 101,000 and 190,000 people, respectively. These two age cohorts increased by more than 27 percent between 1990 and 2000. In 2000, the COG region had a greater percentage of population (nearly 54 percent) between the ages of 25 and 59, compared to the United States, which had more than 48 percent of the population within these age cohorts.

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

The COG region's median age increased 2.2 years over the past decade, from 32.7 years in 1990 to 34.9 in 2000. Almost every jurisdiction experienced an increase, except for the City of College Park, which decreased 1.2 years to 21.7 years, making it the jurisdiction with the youngest median age. The Cities of Bowie and Fairfax both had a 3.5 year increase, the largest in the region. The oldest median age in the region is in the City of Falls Church (39.7 years), followed by the City of Rockville (37.8 years) and the City of Fairfax (37.0 years).

The median age in the Maryland suburbs of the COG region increased 2.7 years from 32.5 years in 1990 to 35.2 years in 2000. Northern Virginia also experienced an increase in median age, from 32.8 years in 1990 to 34.7 years in 2000. In comparison, the United States population increased its median age 2.4 years from 32.9 years in 1990 to 35.3 years in 2000.

According to Census 2000, the COG region has a population comprised of 48.6 percent male and 51.4 percent female.

The District of Columbia and the City of Takoma Park have the highest proportions of female population: 52.9 percent.

Almost every jurisdiction in the COG Region has slightly more women than men. Two exceptions are the City of College Park and Arlington County, which have male populations that are 52.4 percent and 50.4 percent, respectively.

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

The share of the COG region's population under 18 years of age increased from 23.1 percent in 1990 to 24.9 percent in 2000.

Prince William County has the largest percentage of people under 18 years (30.4 percent), followed by Loudoun County (29.8 percent), and Frederick County (27.6 percent).


Loudoun County has experienced the greatest percent change over the past decade, 117.3 percent, reflecting the County's rapid population growth. The City of Bowie and Frederick County also had significant increases in their populations under 18 years of age, 48.4 percent and 35.7 percent, respectively.

The proportion of the COG region's senior population (persons aged 65 and older) increased from 8.7 percent in 1990 to 9.1 percent in 2000. In comparison, 12.4 percent of the U.S. population is age 65 years and older.

The City of Rockville has the highest local share of senior citizens (13.1 percent), followed by the City of Fairfax (12.8 percent) and the District of Columbia (12.2 percent). Prince William and Loudoun counties have the smallest percentages of population 65 and over, 4.8 percent and 5.6 percent, respectively.

While most jurisdictions in the COG region experienced an increase in the number of people age 65 and older, several jurisdictions experienced a decrease in this age category. These include the Cities of College Park, Falls Church and Takoma Park; the District of Columbia and Arlington County.

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
Population Relationships in the COG Region

More than 4.1 million people (97.8 percent) in the COG region are counted as being a part of a household. (A household includes all of the people who occupy a housing unit.)

In the COG region, householders (typically the person, or one of the people, in whose name the home is owned or rented) account for 37 percent of the population. Children living in a household, regardless of age, comprise 29 percent of the population. Spouses in households account for 18 percent of the population. Other population relationships in households include other relatives and nonrelatives, which each contribute 7 percent of the population.

Those not living in households are otherwise part of the group quarters population. There are two general categories of people in group quarters: 1) the institutionalized population (such as correctional institutions, nursing homes, and juvenile institutions) and 2) the noninstitutionalized population (such as college dormatories, military quarters, and group homes). In the COG region, 87,200 people or 2.1 percent of the population are included in group quarters.

Family households comprise 64.7 percent of all households in the COG region. Prince William County (76.9 percent), Loudoun County (75.2 percent) and the City of Bowie (74.6 percent) have the highest proportions of family households in the region.


Families living with their own children under age 18 account for 32.4 percent of households in the COG region. Married couple families account for 48.0 percent of households. Prince William, Loudoun and Frederick counties have the highest proportions of these two household types in the region.

Nonfamily households compose 35.3 percent of total households in the region. A majority of this household type are householders who live alone. In the COG region that amounts to 27.5 percent of all households. The City of Alexandria (55.2 percent), Arlington County (54.5 percent) and the District of Columbia (54.0 percent) have the highest proportions of nonfamily households in the region.

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Households in Region Increase Nearly 16 Percent in Last Decade

The number of households in the region increased by 217,160 households (15.8 percent) to total 1,595,504 households.

During the 1990s the region saw a 23 percent increase in the number of householders living alone. In 2000, the number of householders living alone totaled 439,036, comprising 27.5 percent of all households. The number of "seniors" living alone increased by 18.3 percent in the last decade to nearly 102,000 households.

Married couples with children under 18 accounted for more than 377,000 households or 23.6 percent of total households. This household type grew by 9.4 percent during the last decade.



During the 1990s, female house-holders living with their own children (under 18 years) grew by 9.5 percent, totaling 113,565 households in the region in 2000.


In 2000, female headed households with children comprised 7.1 percent of total households in the region. In comparison, 7.2 percent of all U.S. households make up this household type.

Prince George's County has the largest percent of female-headed households with children, 11.3 percent, followed by the District of Columbia (9.9 percent) and the City of Greenbelt (8.9 percent).

- Census 2000 reveals that the average household size in the COG region is 2.59 persons (which is also the same figure for the U.S. average household size).
- The outer jurisdictions of Prince William and Loudoun counties have the highest average household size in the region, respectively, 2.94 persons and 2.82 persons.
- In comparison, the central jurisdictions have a low average household size, 2.04 persons in the City of Alexandria and 2.15 persons in Arlington County.
- The Maryland suburbs have an average household size of 2.70 persons, followed by Northern Virginia with 2.63 persons. The District of Columbia is significantly lower with an average of 2.16 persons per household.

• Of the 1,672,101 housing units in the region, 76,597 or 4.6 percent of these units are vacant. In comparison, the United States has a 3.1 percent housing vacancy rate.


- Nearly 35 percent of the region's vacant housing units are located in the District of Columbia. The District's housing vacancy rate is 9.6 percent, followed by the City of Greenbelt (8.0 percent) and the City of Falls Church (5.4 percent).
- Jurisdictions in the region which experienced the lowest vacancy rates include the City of Fairfax (2.1 percent), Fairfax County (2.4 percent) and the City of Bowie (2.8 percent).

Percent Vacant Housing Units



According to Census 2000, 62 percent of housing units are owner occupied in the region. Conversely, 38 percent of the region's dwellings are occupied by renters. The figures for the U.S. reflect a higher ownership rate: 66 percent are owner occupied versus 34 percent renter occupied.

Jurisdictions with the highest household ownership rates in the region are the City of Bowie (85 percent), Loudoun County (79 percent) and Frederick County (76 percent).

Jurisdictions with the highest renteroccupied rates include the City of Alexandria (60 percent), the District of Columbia (59 percent) and Arlington County (57 percent).

In absolute terms, Fairfax County has the greatest number of owner occupied households: 248,820 units. The District of Columbia has the greatest amount of renter occupied households: 147,124 units.
