

MD SNAP Data

- 670,000 total participants
- 106,000 older adults (62+)
- 267,000 children



Ending of PHE

- Participation is declining overall
 - ~96,000 households (25%) saw decrease to minimum
- Return of ABAWD Time Limits
 - 5 jurisdictions waived (Balt. City, PG, Wicomico, Somerset, Worcester)
 - 35k ABAWD population, 50% in waived areas
 - 75k discretionary exemptions
 - Guidance on new exemptions soon
- Benefit adequacy and eligibility
 - Extending student eligibility
 - Minimum benefit increase coalition

State Programs

- Older Adult Minimum
 - \$40 a month for 62+
 - Increased from original \$30 a month

- Restaurant Meals Program
 - Implementation began 2022
 - 2 Soul Sisters and Burger King
 - More restaurants seeking to join, barriers at multiple levels

Summer SNAP for Children

Summer SNAP for Children

- MD specific state-funded SNAP benefit
- Matched by jurisdiction
- \$30/month per child for June-August, \$10 for December
- Funding increase from \$200,000 to \$4.4 million
- Jurisdiction decides eligibility/selection of households

EBT Fraud Reimbursement

Federal Plan

- Only reimburses SNAP benefits
- Covers theft between 10/1/2022-9/30/2024
- Reimburses up to two months
- Can be submitted online or in person
- Claims must be made within 45 days of noticing theft

State Plan

- Reimburses SNAP and cash benefits
- Covers theft between 1/1/2021-9/30/2022
- No monthly cap on reimbursement
- Can be submitted online or in person
- Currently no deadline on submitting claims
- Potential to cover theft beyond retroactive if state funds are available

EBT Fraud Reimbursement Data

As of June 2023

- ❖ 16,000 claims
- ❖ 11,600 approved
- 1,100 denied but eligible with state plan
- \$4.7 million SNAP & \$2.3 million cash reimbursed

MD Hunger Solutions SNAP Call Center

- Fielding 100-180 callers per week
 - Renewals continue to be pain point
 - Leads to churn
 - Fraud claims steadily rising
 - Card locking introduced July 1
 - Application navigation
 - Case management and technical assistance
