

Why share now?

- Some high-level findings really stand out
- Want to keep the momentum going
- More in-depth analysis coming (full report in 2018)





Survey Methods

- Online MetroQuest survey tool
- Aim: To gather general attitudes and opinions
- Two methods:
 - Random sample geographically representative
 - Open survey open to anyone; sought a broad reach
- Available from June 17 to August 21



Preliminary Findings

Random Sample:

755 respondents

Open Survey:

5,460 respondents

TOTAL:

6,215 respondents

Reliability "It's important that I can count on getting where

I'm going on time without unexpected delays."

Affordability "It's important that I can afford the travel options

that work best for me."

Travel Time "It's important that I can get where I want to go

as quickly as possible."

Travel Options "It's important that I have options other than

driving to get where I want to go."

Safety "It's important that I feel safe from personal

harm or injury when traveling."


as a top factor influencing their travel choices

TIME SPENT IN TRAFFIC

"Traffic makes it take too long to drive where I need to go."

NEED FOR RAIL TRANSIT

"More or better rail transit options would make my travel experience better."




What ideas do people have for improving the transportation system?

16,889 markers!

 Markers were spread throughout the region and included numerous ideas within each of the modal categories





Main Takeaways

- Reliability is at the top of people's minds, followed by travel time
- People are most concerned with traffic congestion and time spent in traffic, and would like more or better rail transit options
- As projects, programs, and policies are further developed by submitting jurisdictions, keeping these regional priorities and issues in mind can help better serve the residents of the region



Next Steps

- Analysis will continue throughout fall and early winter,
 with a scheduled release of a full report in early 2018
- Future analysis topics:
 - Identify jurisdictions and sub-areas which were over- and underrepresented in the random sample
 - Show the sociodemographic make-up of both samples, including age, gender, race and ethnicity, disability status, income, and usual travel mode
 - Cross-tabulations to shed light on associations between responses
 - Qualitative analysis based on the written-in answers and comments provided by respondents
