# Background

- COG Cooperative Purchasing Program (since 1971)
  - Chief Purchasing Officers Committee (CPOC)
- COG Board created CEEPC Climate, Energy and Environment Policy Committee (since 2009)
  - 2010-2012 Regional Climate and Energy Workplan (1/10)
    - Calls for local governments to adopt green purchasing policies
- Green Purchasing Workshops (12/10, 9/12)



### Obstacles

- Most procurement specialists are not environmental specialists
- Most jurisdictions in the region have decentralized procurement
- Getting started (prioritization and products)
- Tracking existing green procurement
- Can take a long time for jurisdictions to issue a new RFP
- Economic downturn



## **Opportunities**

- Green procurement champions
- Regional RPN membership
- COG Rider Clause in local green contracts
- State contracts
- US EPA Green Power Partnership collaborative effort to procure solar PV
- National cooperative procurement contracts such as US Communities Go Green Program and Western States Contracting Alliance
