

District of Columbia

Clean Energy

 Solar Works DC, the District's solar installation job training program, continued to grow the city's clean energy workforce, graduating its 288th resident in 2021 since the program began in 2017.

Buildings

 DCSEU completed the Low-Income Decarbonization Pilot program, which incorporated rooftop solar and involved the replacement of natural gas or oil systems with electric systems in each home.

Transportation

• The Capital Bikeshare program now features 1,000 electric bikes and announced the purchase of 2,500 more over the next two years.

City of Alexandria

Clean Energy

 The City offsets nearly 90% of its operational electricity use with purchased Renewable Energy Certificates (RECs) from wind, solar, and other renewable energy resources from around the United States.

Buildings

 The City of Alexandria's Green Building Policy, adopted by City Council in 2019, new public development is required to also achieve net-zero energy.

Transportation

 As of November 2022, DASH operates 14 battery electric buses as part of its transition to operating a 100% Zero-Emission Bus fleet:

Montgomery County

Clean Energy

 The 6 MW Oaks Landfill community solar project is 95% completed; expected to come online this month.

Buildings

• In Nov 2022, the County Council passed the Comprehensive Building Decarbonization legislation (Bill 13-22), which will require the County to issue all-electric building standards by December 31, 2026.

Transportation

 The Montgomery County Green Bank, with a grant from General Motors, launched the Electric Vehicle Charger Infrastructure program for affordable multifamily properties to install up to 2 dual chargers at up to 30 properties.
