The Transportation Planning Board recently adopted <u>Equity Emphasis Areas</u> to support the Title VI / Environmental Justice Analysis of the Financially Constrained Long-Range Transportation Plan. Gerrit Knaap, National Center for Smart Growth Research & Education Executive Director

To leverage the maximum benefits from the Purple Line transit project investment, and drawing on experience from other metro areas, the National Center for Smart Growth led an open and transparent stakeholder engagement process to create a Community Development Agreement for the Purple Line Corridor. By creating this shared corridor-wide vision, local and regional governments, community organizations, non-profits, philanthropy, education, and business organizations are committing to leverage the economic and community opportunities for the benefit of all who live, work, and invest in the corridor. With construction for the Purple Line now underway, Dr. Knaap will discuss the Coalition's ongoing work, corridor research, and critical next steps to engage stakeholders, align existing efforts, and leverage resources to maximize the return on this investment.

1:00 P.M. 6. BUILDING A GREATER COLLEGE PARK: PLACEMAKING & REAL ESTATE ACTIVITIES LEADING TO COMMUNITY TRANSFORMATION

College Park is booming. Over 30 projects, including The Hotel at the University of Maryland, four new academic buildings and new downtown amenities, are under way. The boom - called Greater College Park - is the result of cooperative work between the city, Prince George's County, state, private developers and the university. Activities include: enhancing the Baltimore Ave corridor, attracting private sector companies and entrepreneurs to our Discovery District, and strengthening the university's research enterprise. The progress is the realization of the University District Vision, a collaborative effort spearheaded by the College Park City-University Partnership that also features sustainability, transportation, schools and safety.
