Please allow enough time before and no later than 11:59 p.m. EDT, April 19, 2010 to complete the IJ in the GRT and submit the required application materials using www.grants.gov.

This worksheet applies only to SHSP, UASI, MMRS, and CCP applicants. Operation Stonegarden (OPSG) applicants should refer to Part VIII – "Other Information," Section E – "OPSG Operations Order Template" of the FY 2010 HSGP Guidance and Application Kit for the OPSG application template.

The National Capital Region (NCR) strategic plan initiative 3.2.1 is to develop and implement common regional information sharing and collaboration frameworks in order to enable law enforcement and other public safety entities to exchange critical information in a secure environment. The NCR has made significant investments in this area and has created key tools for the exchange of law enforcement and emergency management information throughout the region. The National Capital Region (NCR) seeks to maintain these information sharing platforms and expand the data usage through both the linked data network and field of use.

Maintaining Information Sharing Capabilities

- LInX The Law Enforcement Information Exchange has been a key investigative tool for law officers across the NCR. Data from the Regional Pawn Data Sharing System (RPDSS), federal, state, and local agencies combined provide investigators the ability to analyze numerous data streams and provide intelligence on individuals of interest. The NCR seeks to sustain the data network through equipment maintenance, data and user interface enhancements, and shared networked costs.
- AFIS The Automated Fingerprint Identification System and its associated enhancements (i.e., LiveScan, Mugshot recognition) have allowed quick access to biometric information through LInX. Data include fingerprint information, near real-time booking information (LiveScan), and facial recognition (Mugshot). Current mobile AFIS gives patrol officer access to 1.5M arrest records. The NCR will support service maintenance, acquire additional devices, provide training, and purchase air time for data transmission.
- Emergency Management Information Sharing The NCR's emergency managers use several tools to gather and share information for improved situational awareness, including the Emergency Management Network (EMNet) and Web EOCWebEOC is a web based incident management and information sharing tool for emergency managers. It allows incident commanders and EOC operations regionally to have a common view when responding to emergency incidents. The NCR will continue licensing and contractual maintenance for its emergency management information sharing tools with FY2010 UASI funds.

Information Sharing Expansion

LInX hand-held - Previous mobile devices were laptop based. LInX hand-held will
expand the information sharing capability to hand-held devices such as iPhones,
Blackberries, and PDA's. Certified law enforcement officials on foot, bicycles, and
motorcycles will now be able to access LInX data. The initiative will fund planning,
development, testing, and deployment of LInX hand-held.
