

Regional Food Systems Program in COVID-19

- Weekly regional calls with local leaders to share food security and food assistance issues, needs
- Monitoring food supply chain with partners
- Working with member jurisdictions as requested
- Disseminating new communications on food


How Can Local Leaders Help?

- Use an equity lens
- Support food banks, food pantries, and other food providers with financial contributions, volunteer services.
 - Remember providers serving especially vulnerable populations (i.e. Latinx immigrants)
 - Make other connections to the regional food economy when possible (i.e. farmers, food hubs, restaurants)
- Support advocates for stronger safety net programs (i.e. Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program – SNAP) and local food policy changes
 - Examples: DC, MD, and VA Hunger Solutions, local food policy councils
- Invest in coordination of food assistance, technical assistance and other services to farmers, food entrepreneurs, etc.



Montgomery County's Experience

- Created new Food Security Task
 Force to coordinate response
 - Operationalizing COVID-19
 Pandemic Food Security
 Response Strategy
- Made new funding available to emergency food assistance providers and others
- Engaged in on-going collaborations between public, private, and nonprofit stakeholders to support food and nutrition needs of residents



Ag Task Force Check-in

- Ag Task Force been working for one year to develop plan to create a home for regional food and agriculture planning
- Importance of vision for Food and Agricultural Economy Commission and planning for greater regional resilience affirmed at March 2020 CBPC meeting
