Build transportation problem-solving skills with these tips.



Get a Senior SmarTrip card and save money. Metro's yellow SmarTrip card is a "must" for people 65 and older for reduced fares on Metro and buses. Go to the Metro Center station sales office scheduled to re-open in early March, show your picture ID, and get a card or add value to your existing card. www.wmata.com/fares/smartrip/senior.cfm.



Call or email 311 to become part of the solution. Call 311 or go online https://311.dc.gov to report hazards such as broken sidewalks or poorly timed stoplights. For tips on how to effectively report service requests, visit https://www.iona.org/311-service-requests/.

Take TransportDC as an alternative to MetroAccess. People enrolled with MetroAccess may also use TransportDC, a \$5 one-way taxi ride to District destinations. Companions ride at no additional charge. Visit dfhv.dc.gov/service/transport-dc to learn more.



Participate in an Advisory Council. Sit in on a Pedestrian Advisory Council (http://www.walkdcwalk.org/) or Bicycle Advisory Council (http://www.bikedcbike.org/) meeting.

Take an AARP Safe Driver training class. Learn to manage agerelated changes in vision, hearing and reaction time and get a discount on car insurance.
