SUBJECT: Safety Study Update DATE: March 27, 2020

This memo provides an update to the schedule of safety-related agenda items that was originally provided to this committee in a memo under "Other Business" for last month's meeting. It also provides information about personnel changes at the consulting firm that are relevant to the regional safety study.

UPDATED SCHEDULE OF SAFETY BRIEFINGS TO THE TECHNICAL COMMITTEE AND THE TRANSPORTATION PLANNING BOARD

Table 1 shows the current schedule for when the safety study results as well as other safety-related agenda items (such as the next round of annual regional highway safety targets) will be presented to the TPB and the Technical Committee. Changes to the schedule provided to the Technical Committee last month are <u>underlined</u>.
