Grant Context

- Funded by FTA's Enhancing Mobility Innovation (EMI) program
 - Focus on research, development, and/or demonstration projects
 - Nine agencies awarded funding in 2022
- Goals of the EMI program:
 - Support innovation in passenger-centric mobility that meets evolving needs
 - Advance equitable and climate-smart transportation
 - Contribute to knowledge of national significance to improve public transportation service
 - Advance the vision of "mobility for all"



Project Details

- Federal award: \$250,000
 - Total project budget: \$312,500
- Commuter Connections' existing software development team and marketing contractor will provide direct services
- Support letters from: MDOT, MTA, UMD-MTI, TCCSMD, Commute with Enterprise, GWP, and Geico
- Ridematching Committee identified as a guiding body
 - Stakeholder group will be created to provide feedback
- Cooperative agreement with FTA executed in February 2023
- 24+ month project




Project Description

- Primary deliverable: Development of an open-source microtransit platform that aids in the creation and growth of flexible vanpooling
- Differs from traditional vanpooling model (long-distance, inflexible, minimal stops)
- Implementation focus on transit scarce census tracts; Equity Emphasis Areas
- Direct partnership with employers
- "Public Transit" by bridging vanpool operations with General Transit
 Feed Specifications (GTFS) open standards for real-time transit
- NTD compatible



COG Equity Emphasis Areas






Project Goals

- Add a stable, equitable mobility option to transportation disadvantaged communities
- Pilot a post-pandemic flexible vanpool model
- Grow vanpool occupancy
- Reduce the need for costly single occupancy vehicle commute trips
- Grow employer interest in TDM / commuter benefits for essential workers

Employer-Based Search

Identify employer(s) at a vanpool destination



Within each employer:



Conduct employee commute survey



Identify employees along vanpool route

Send email and push notifications via mobile app



Work with employer to contact identified employees directly



Commuter Connections Search

Determine vanpool results



Match route to existing database of active registered commuters within Commuter Connections



COMMUTER OUTREACH



Send email and push notifications via mobile app



Show popup message the next time commuter logs into the website
